Impact Seven, Incorporated in Almena, Wisconsin will receive a Rural Housing and Economic Development grant in the amount of \$400,000. This support for innovative housing and economic development activities grant will involve the development of a 20,000 square foot business incubator, the creation of a revolving loan fund for new and emerging businesses, the creation of an aquaculture facility, and the development of business plans for several industries on and near the Red Cliff Band of the Lake Superior Chippewas Reservation. A total of 30-50 jobs will be created as a result of this grant. Federal, State, local and private resources have been leveraged in an amount of \$3,685,865. Partners for this Project include: The Department of Health and Human Services, U.S. Department of Agriculture, and LISC.

This capacity building grant will enable the tribe to develop an economic diversification plan and to train 30 to 50 tribal members in economic development and business principles in central Wisconsin. In-kind resources from the tribe have been leveraged in an amount of \$102,201.

Ho-Chunk Nation in Black River Falls, Wisconsin will receive a Rural Housing and Economic Development grant in the amount of \$400,00. This support for innovative housing and economic development grant will enable the tribe to develop an economic plan which consists of the construction of a health care center, health care training and health care service jobs for tribal members in central Wisconsin. A total of 75 jobs will be created/retained and 72 persons will be trained. Federal, local and in-kind resources have been leveraged in an amount of \$5,451,095. Partners in this Project include: Indian Health Service and the Western Wisconsin Technical College.
