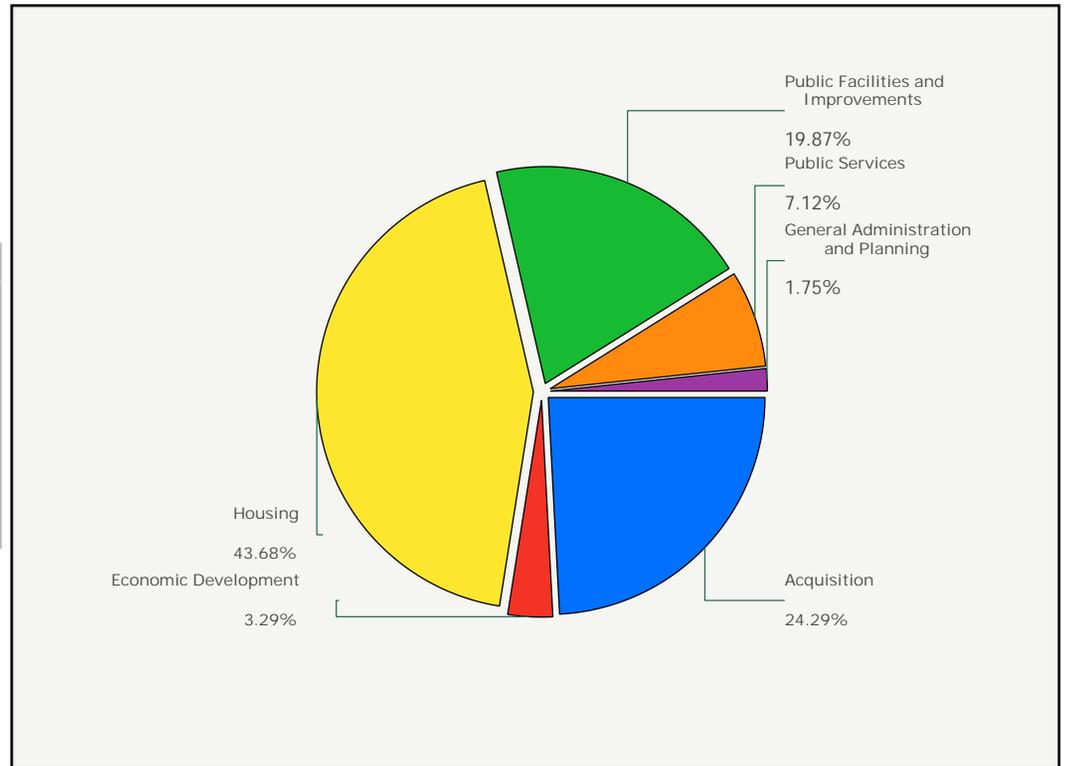

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)

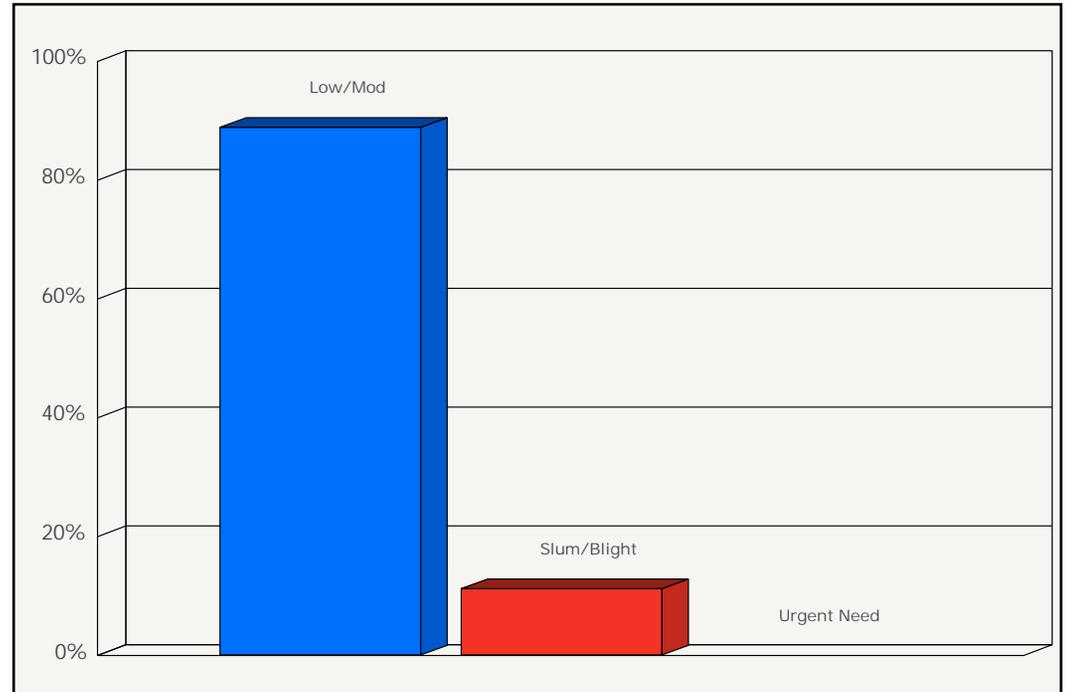

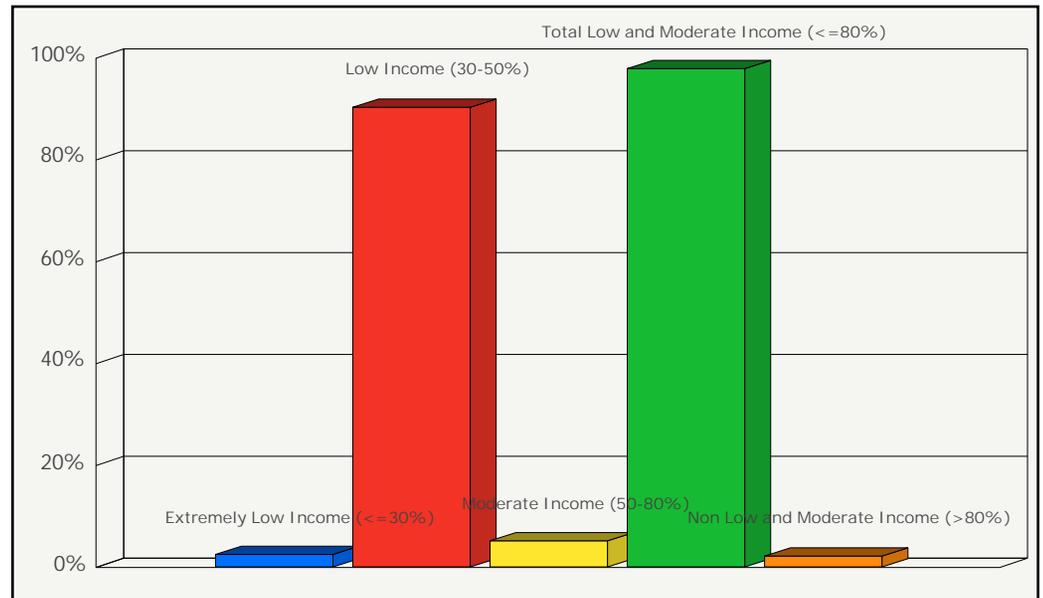

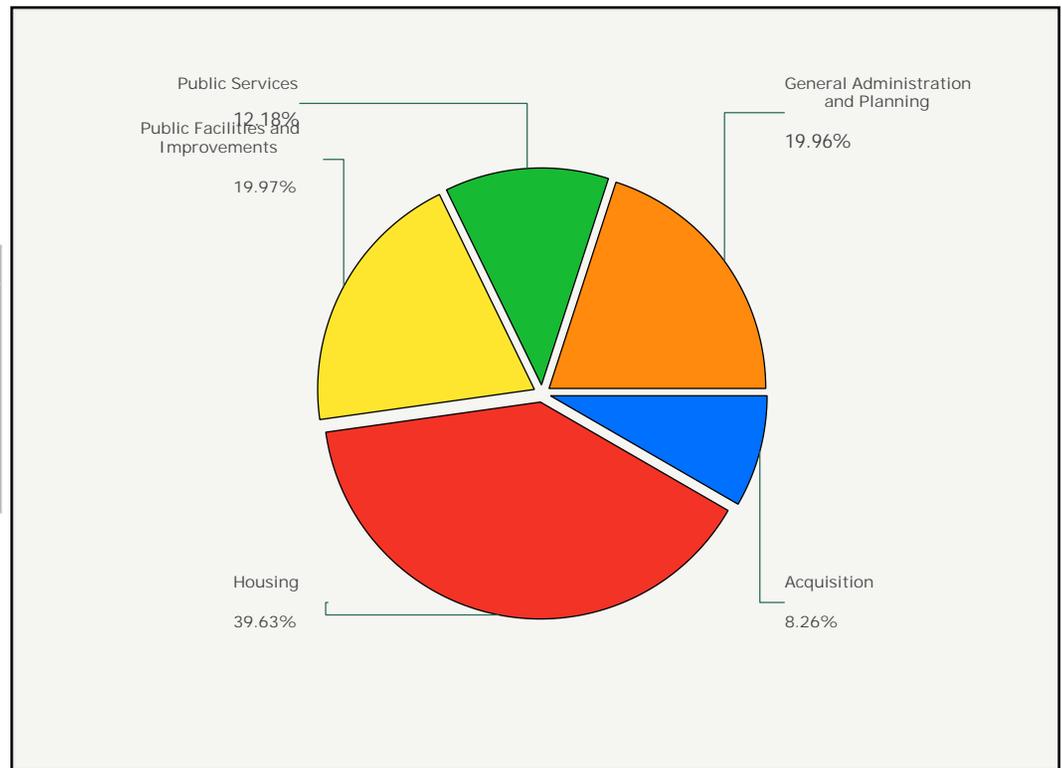

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



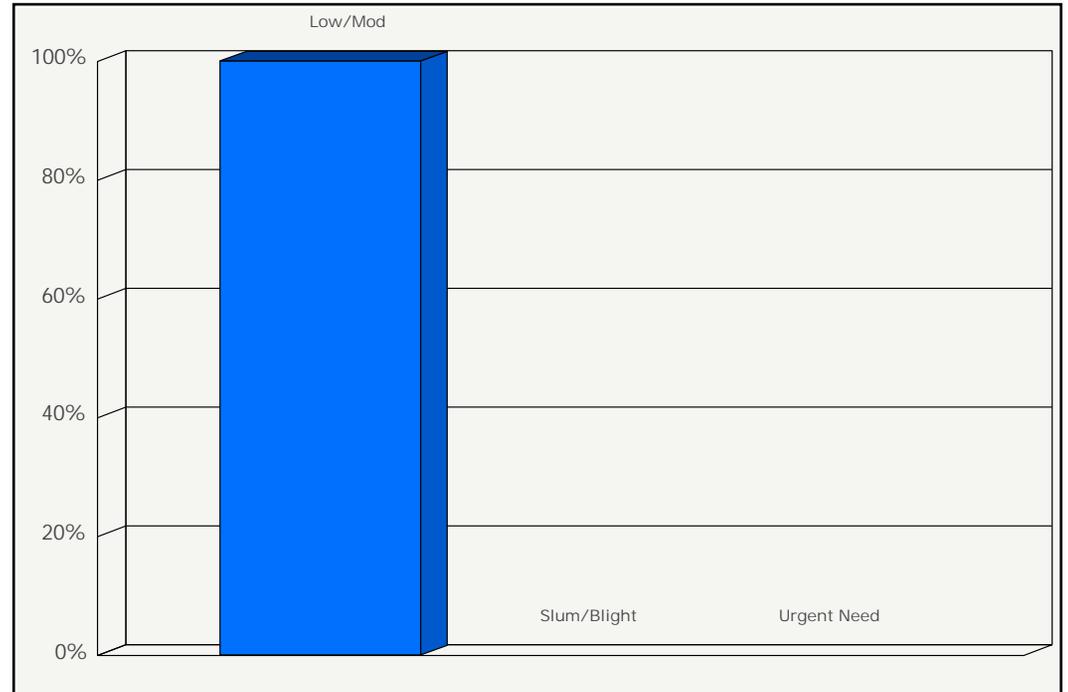

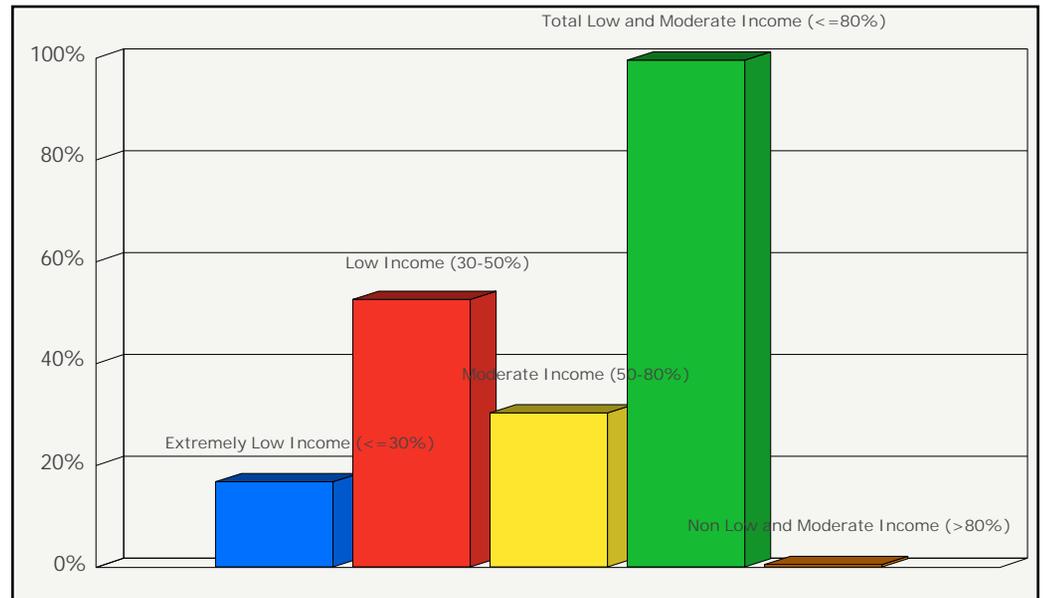

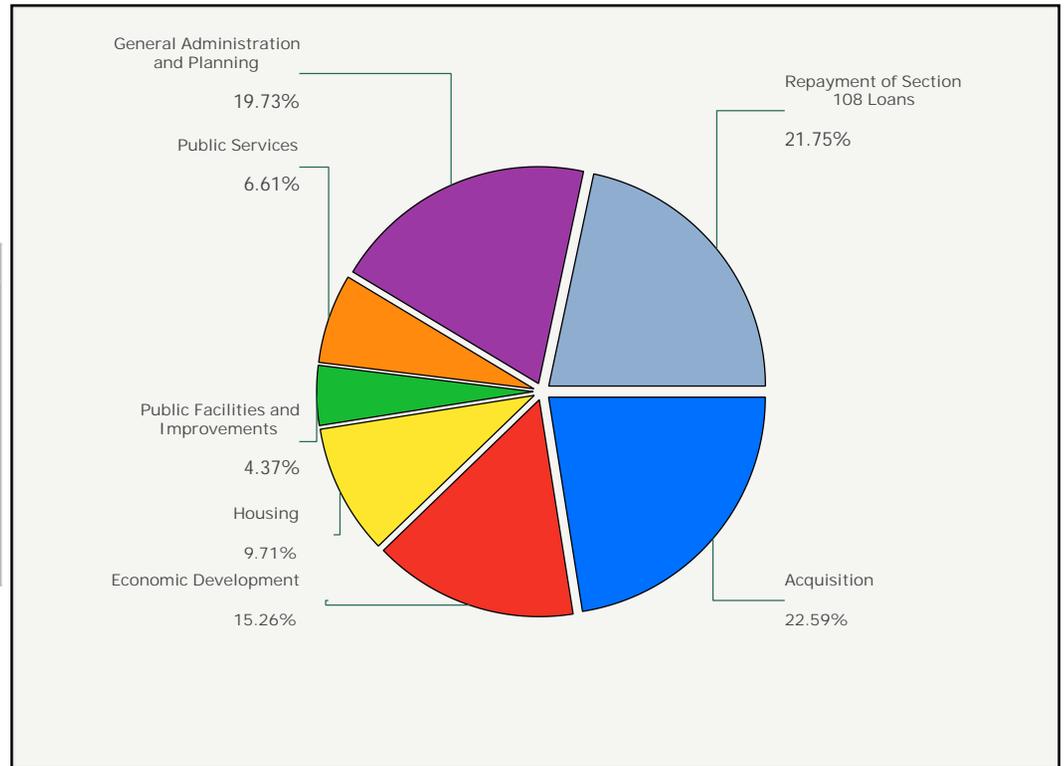

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



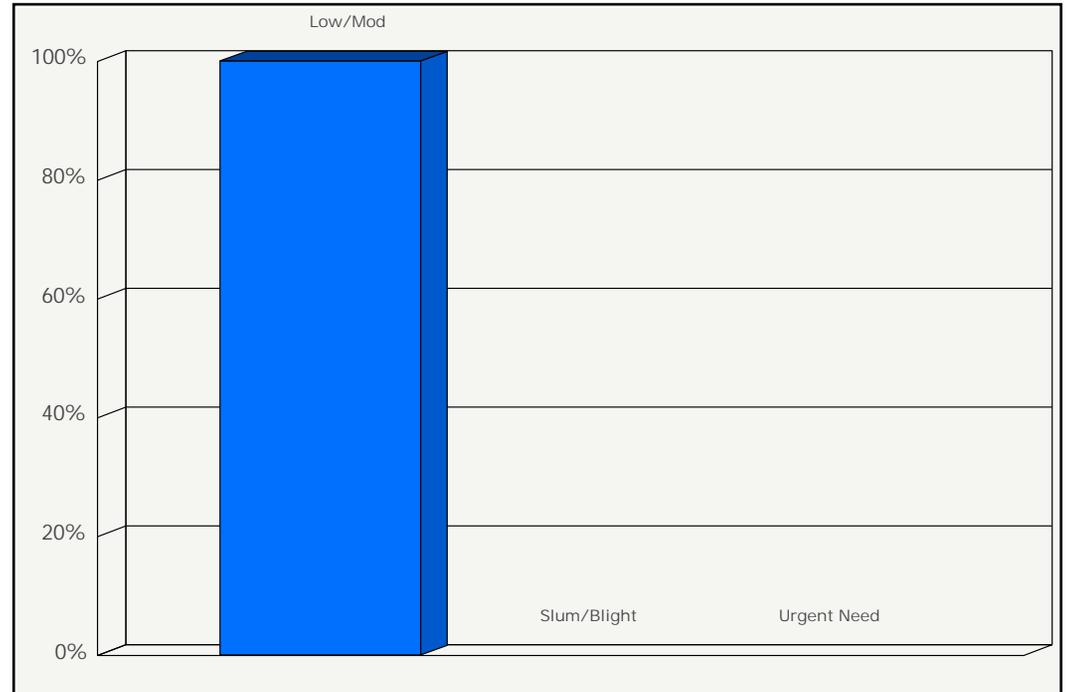

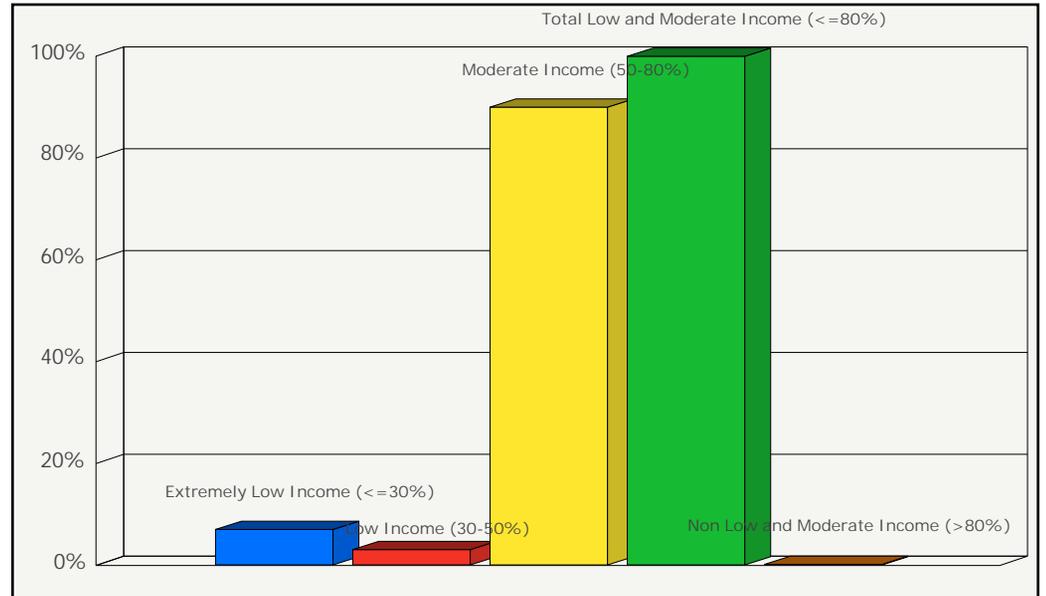

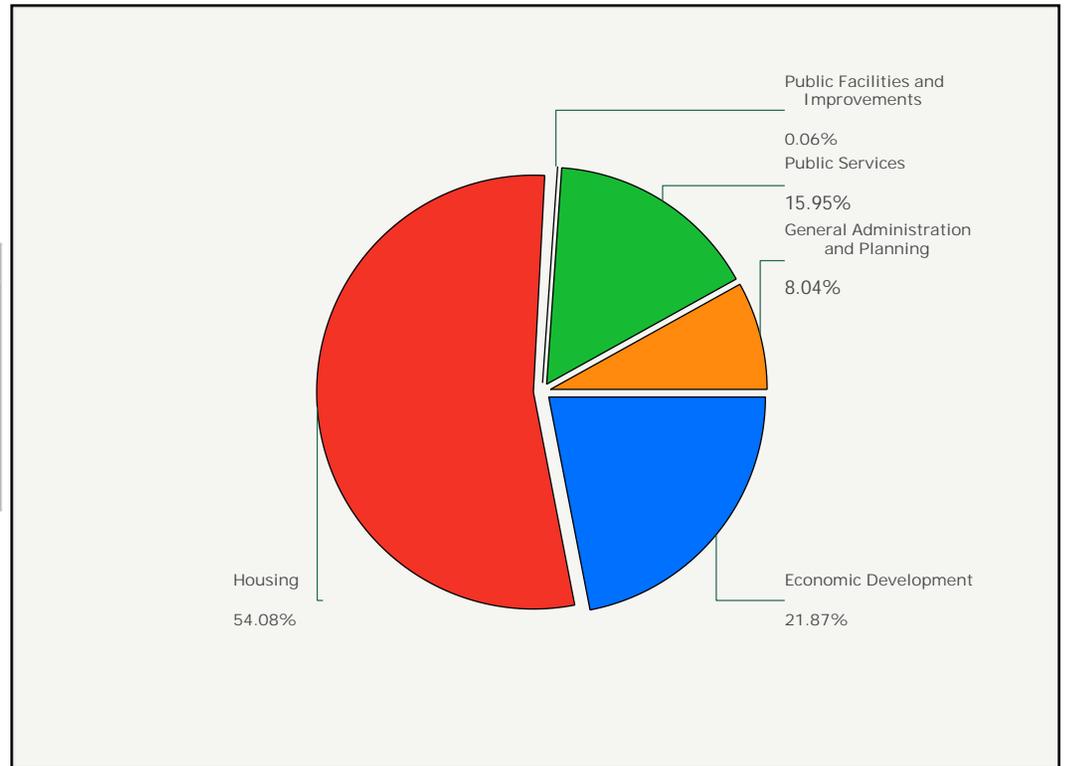

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



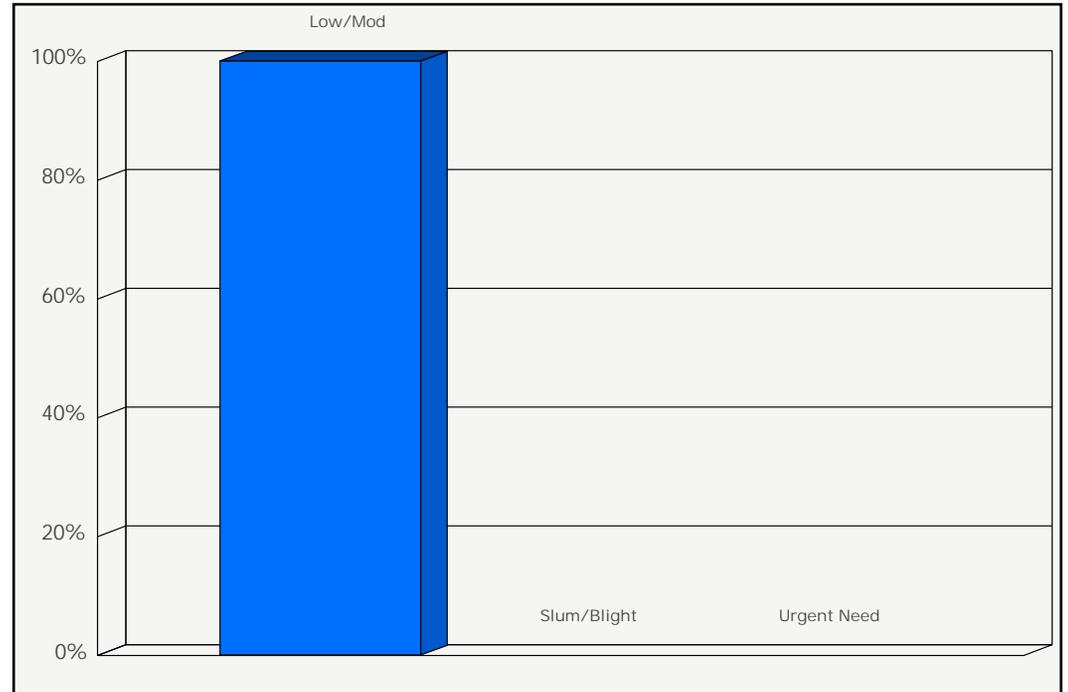

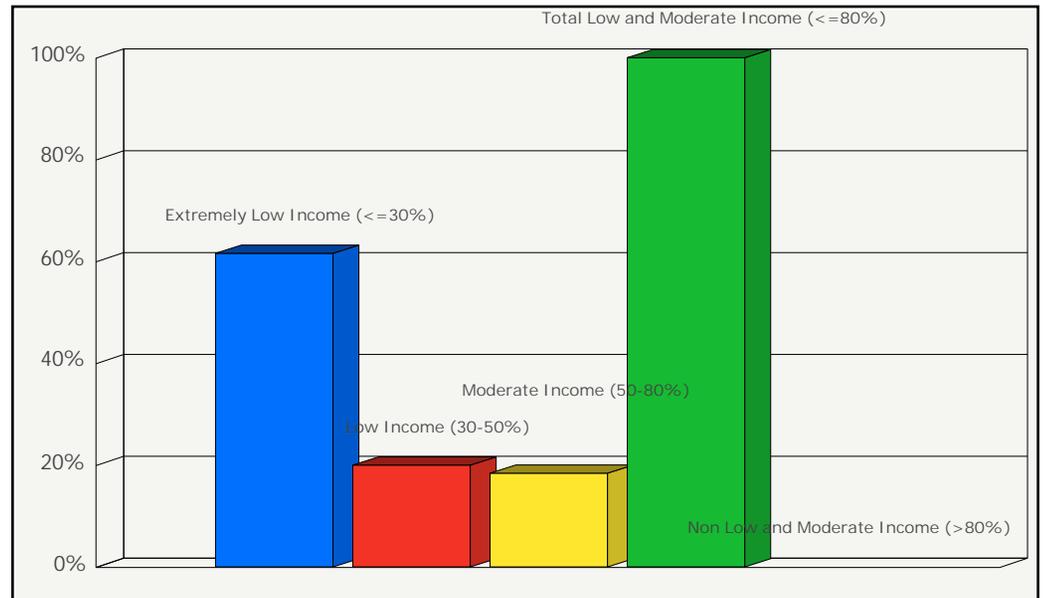

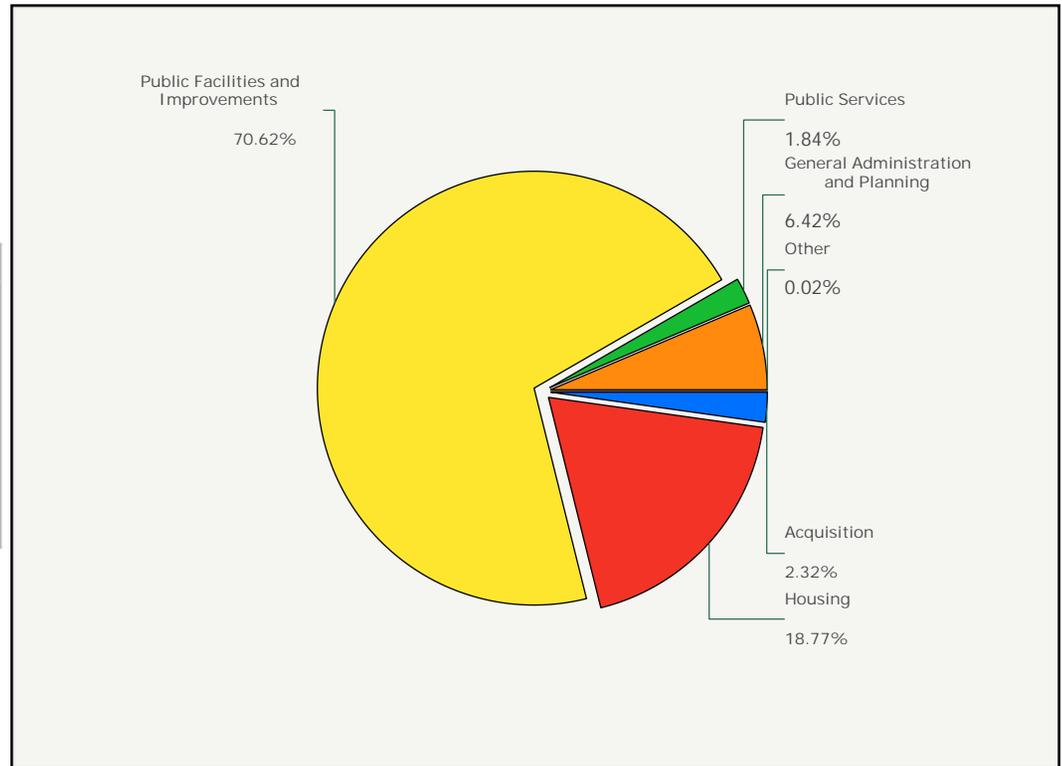

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



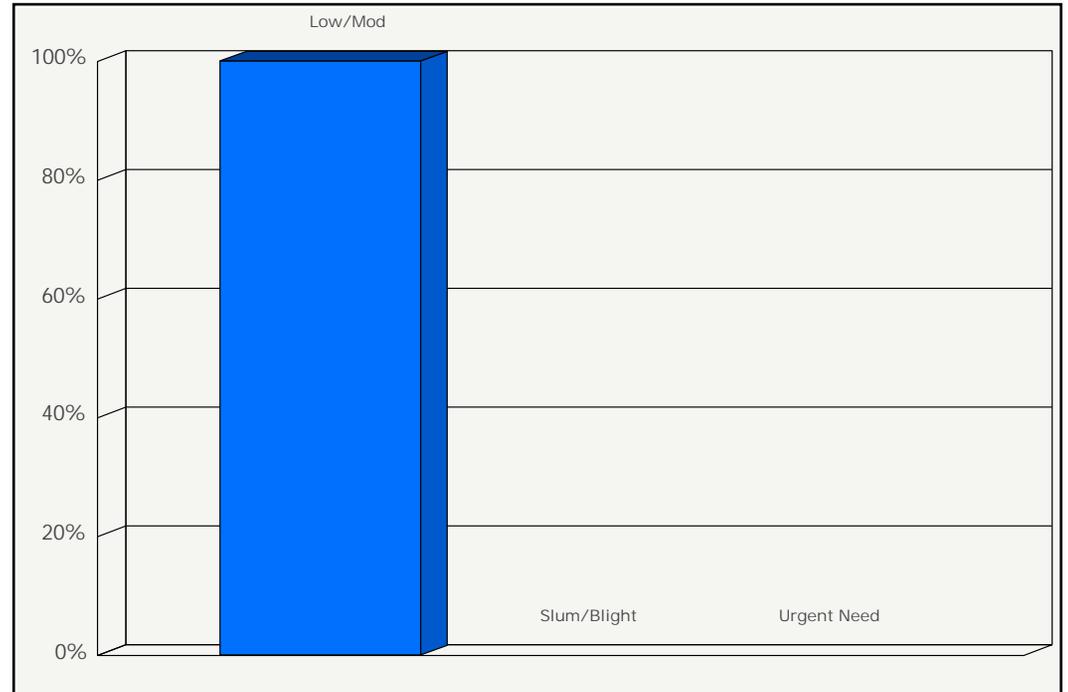

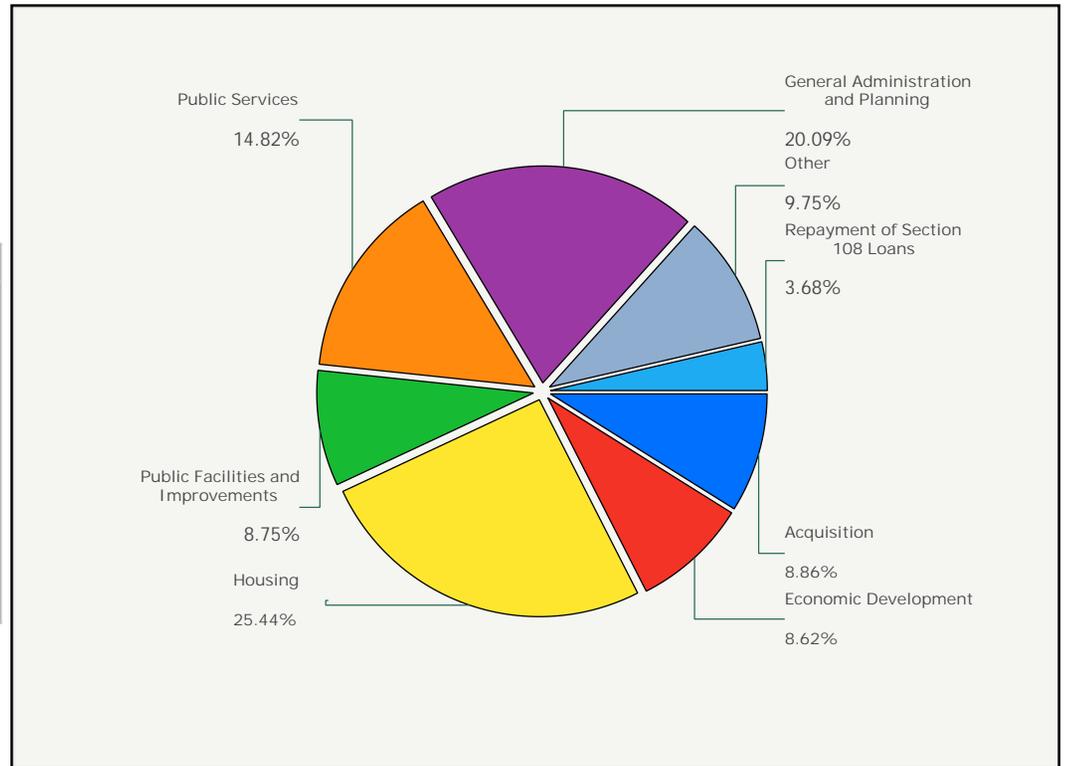

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)

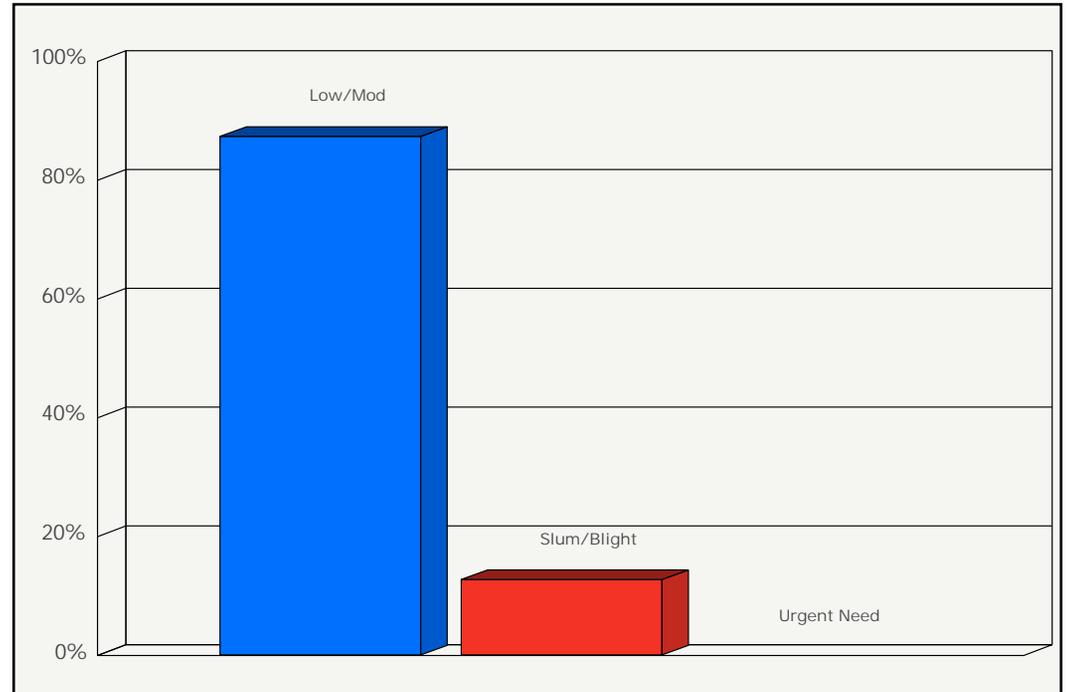

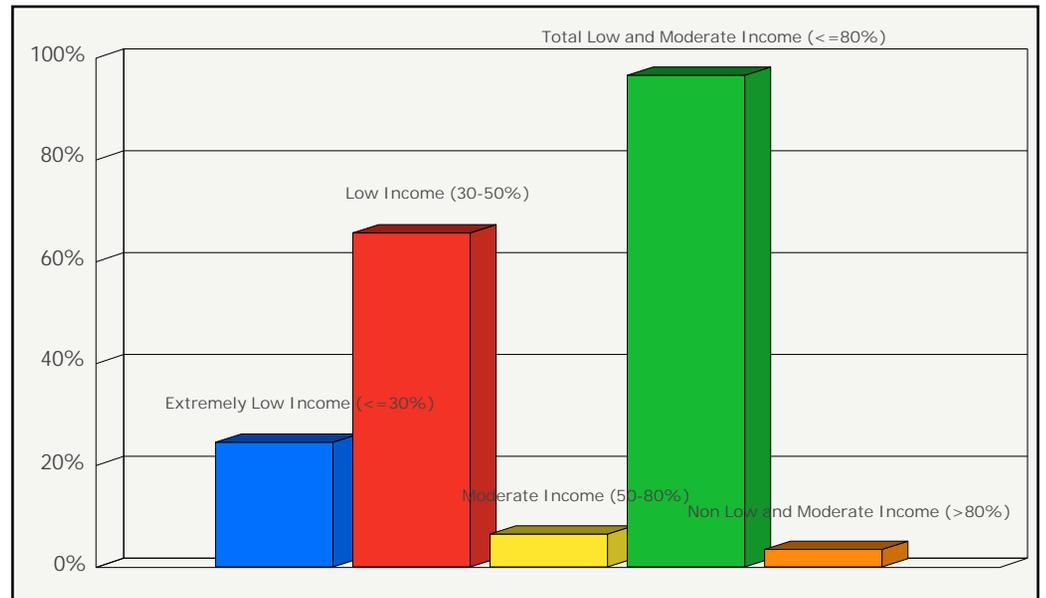

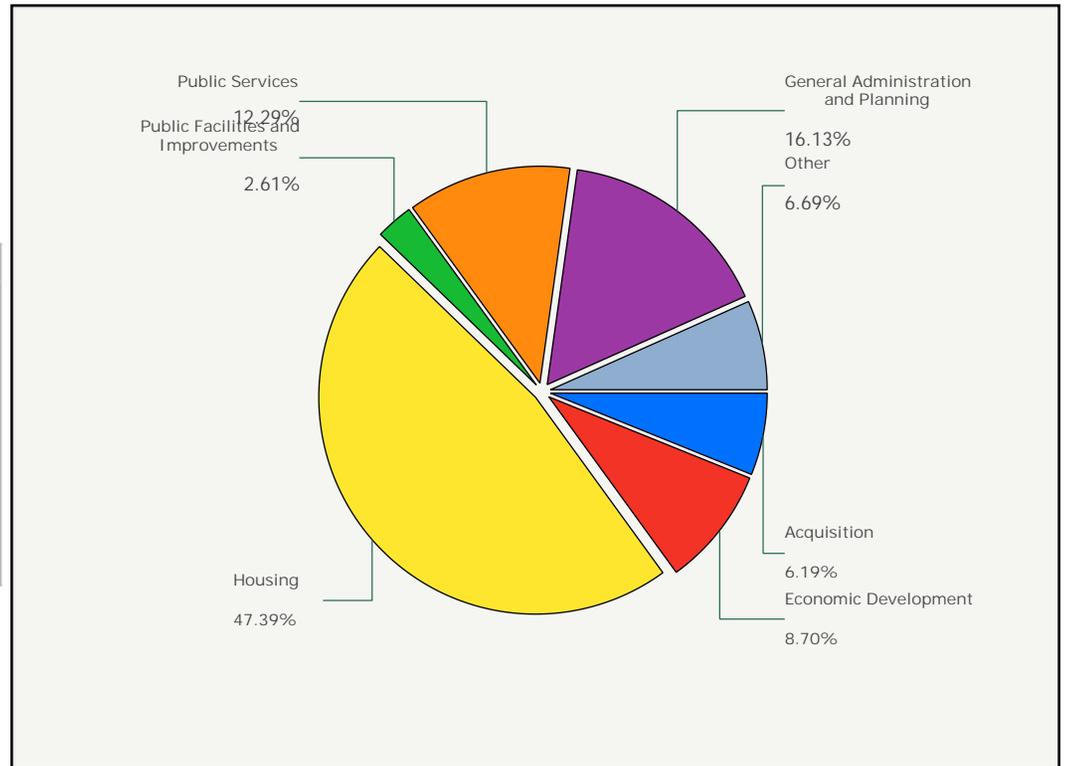

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



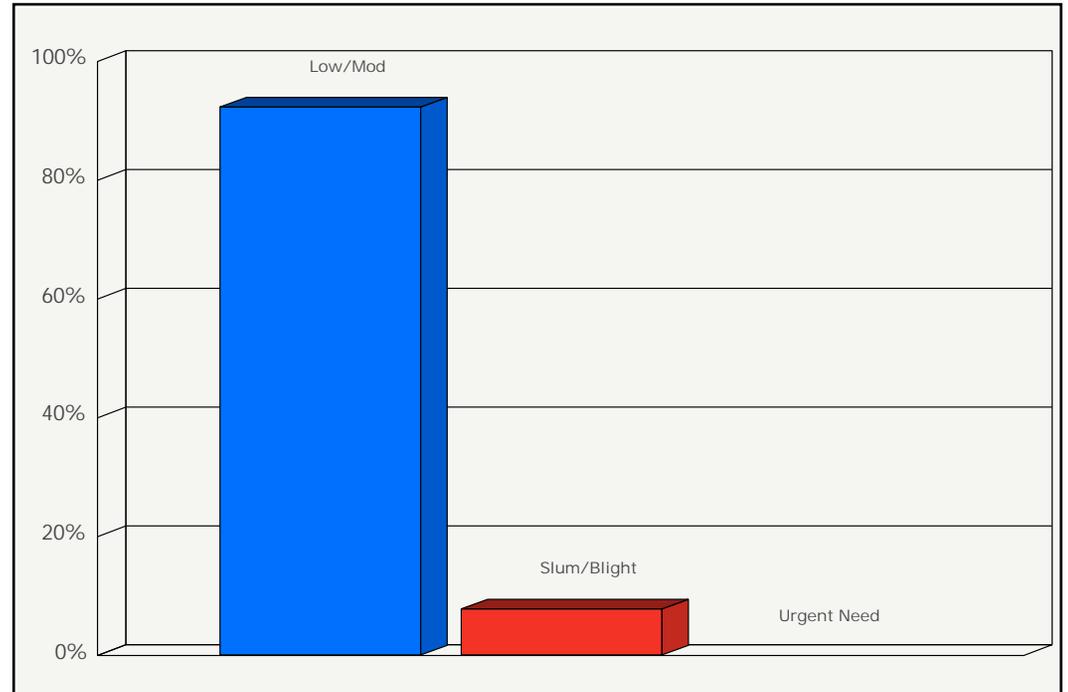

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



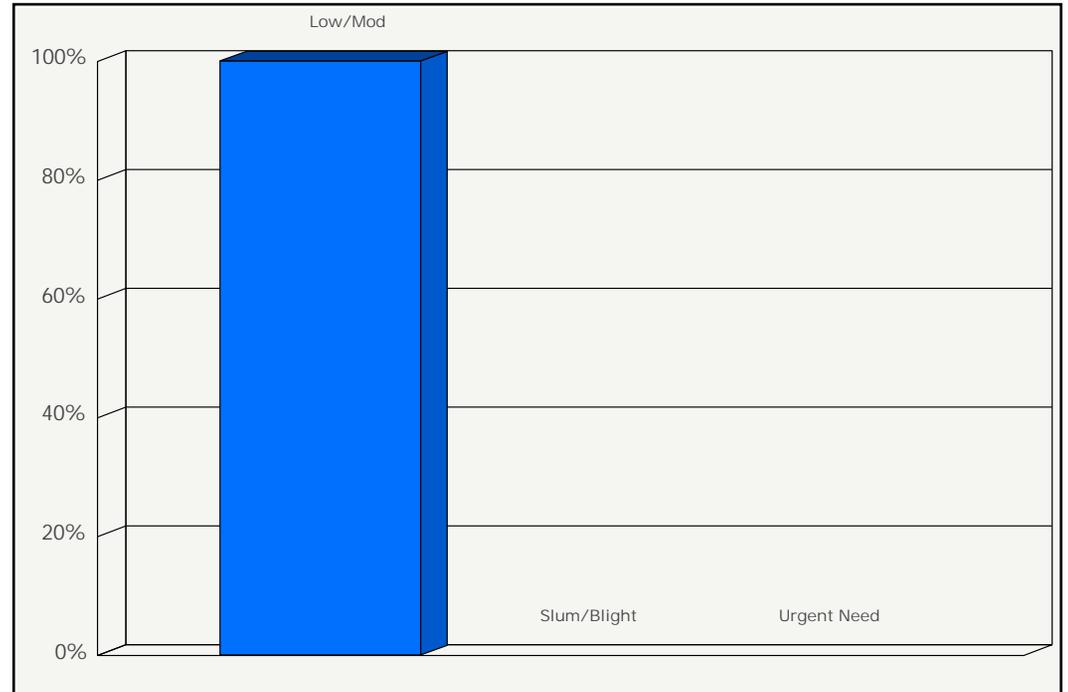

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



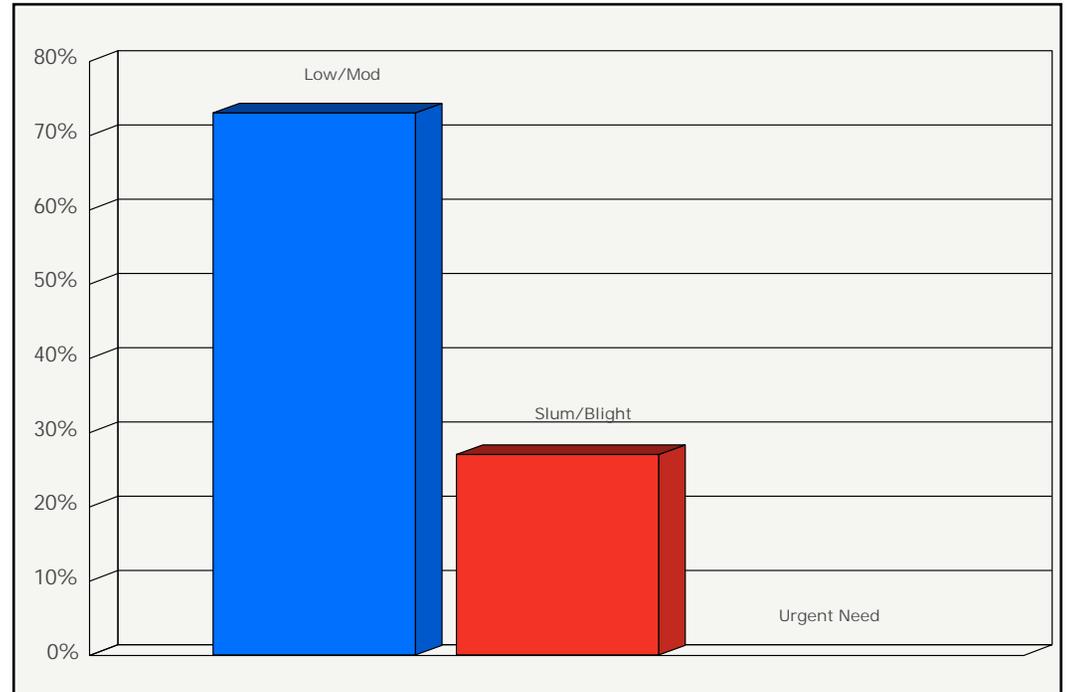

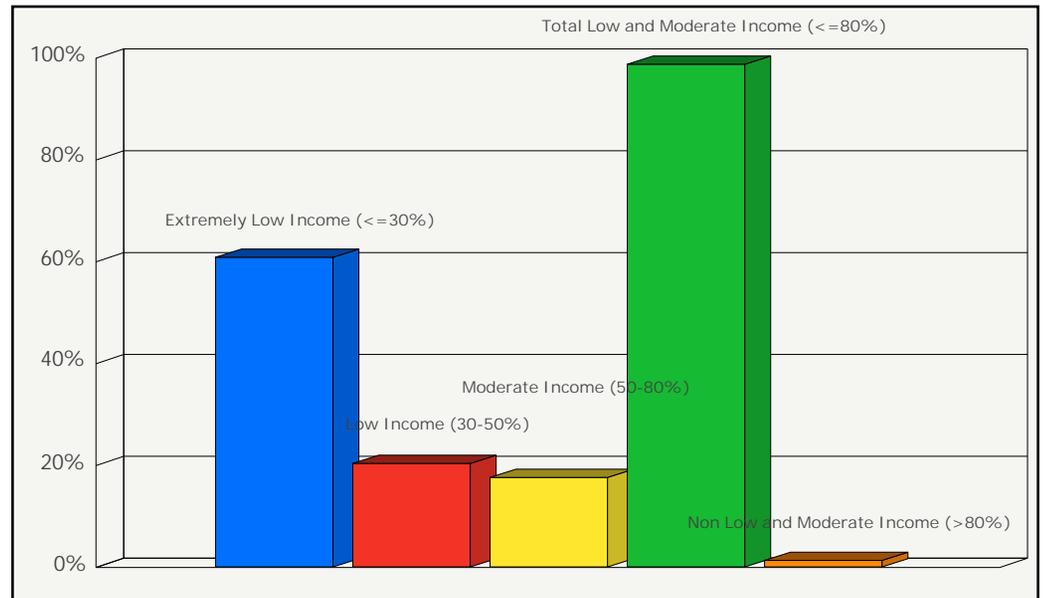

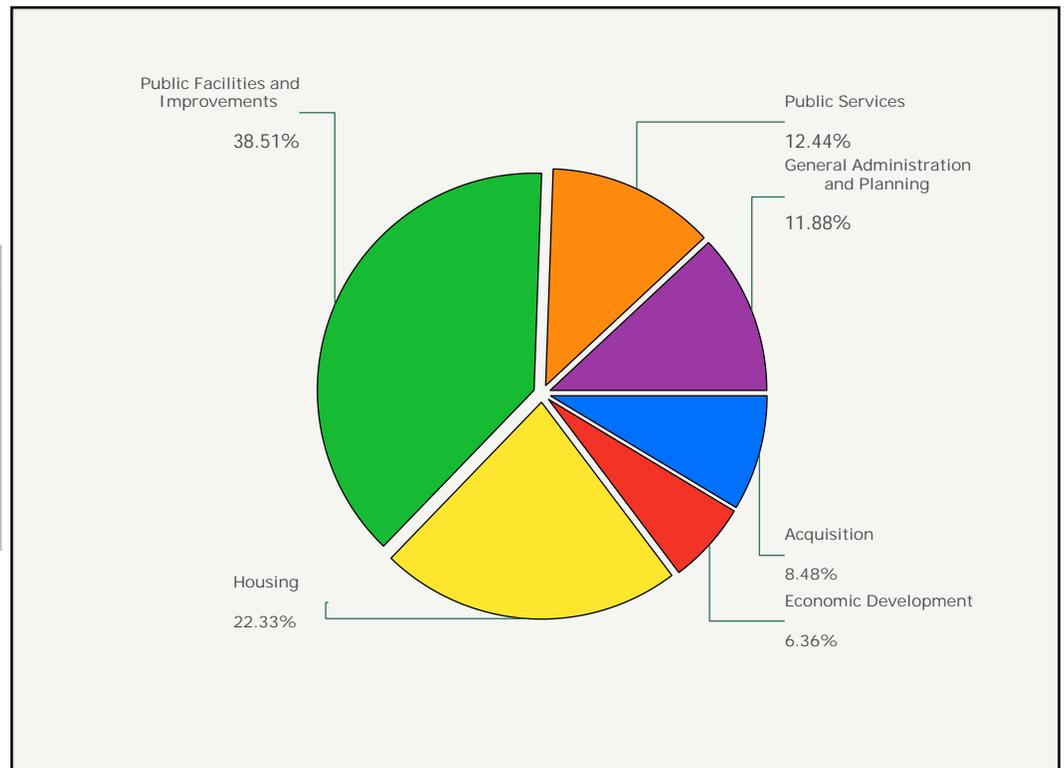

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



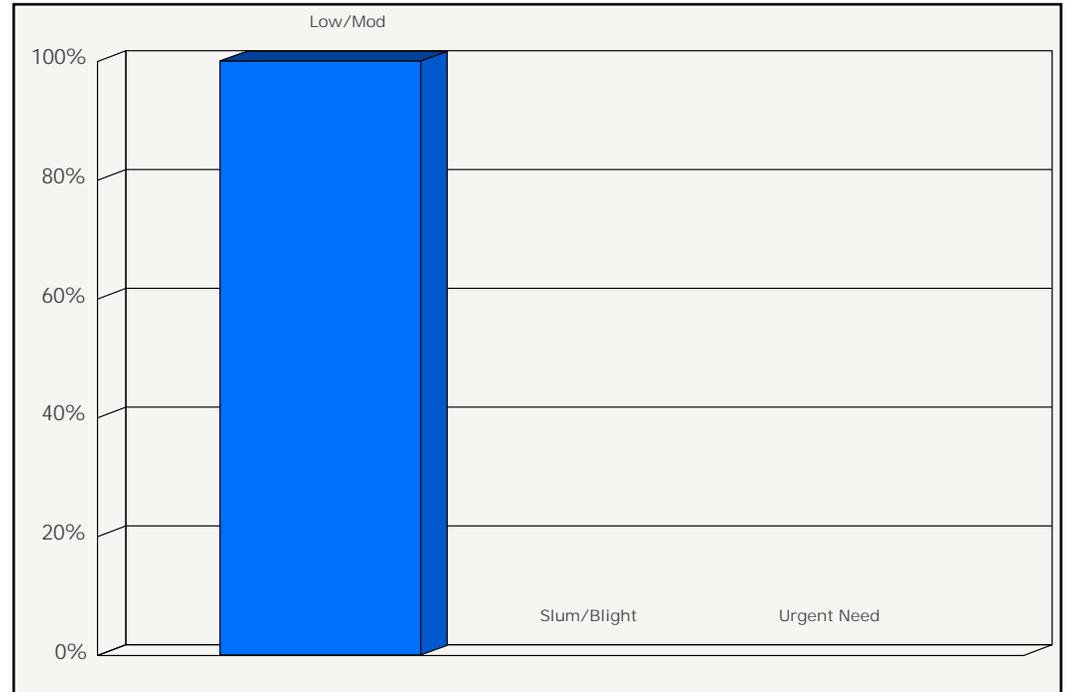

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



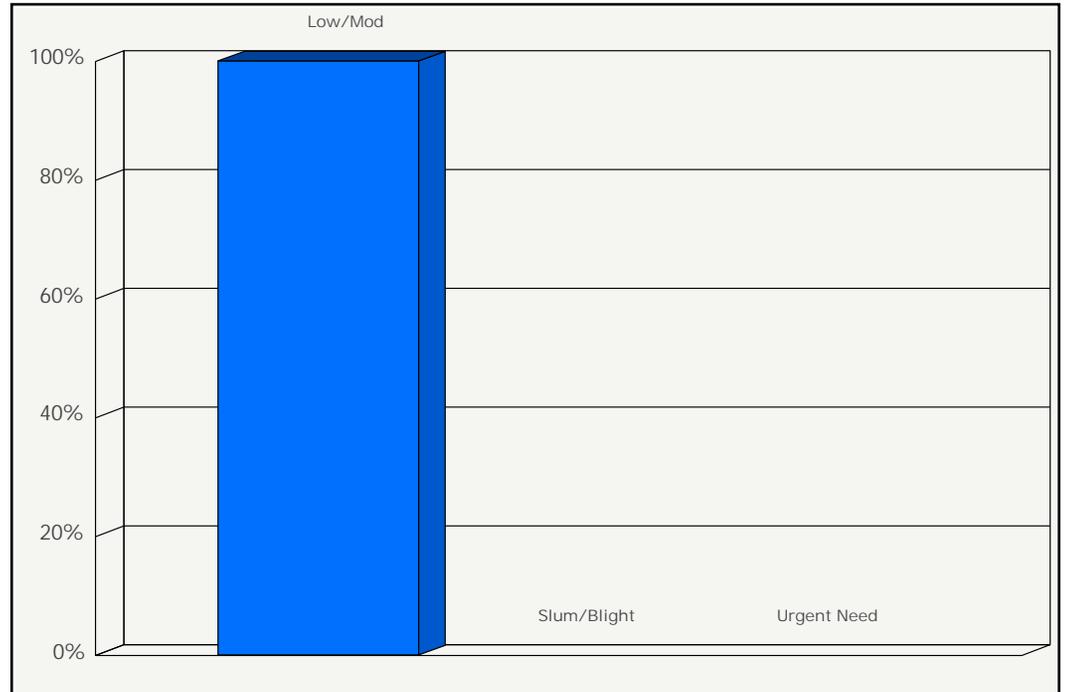

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



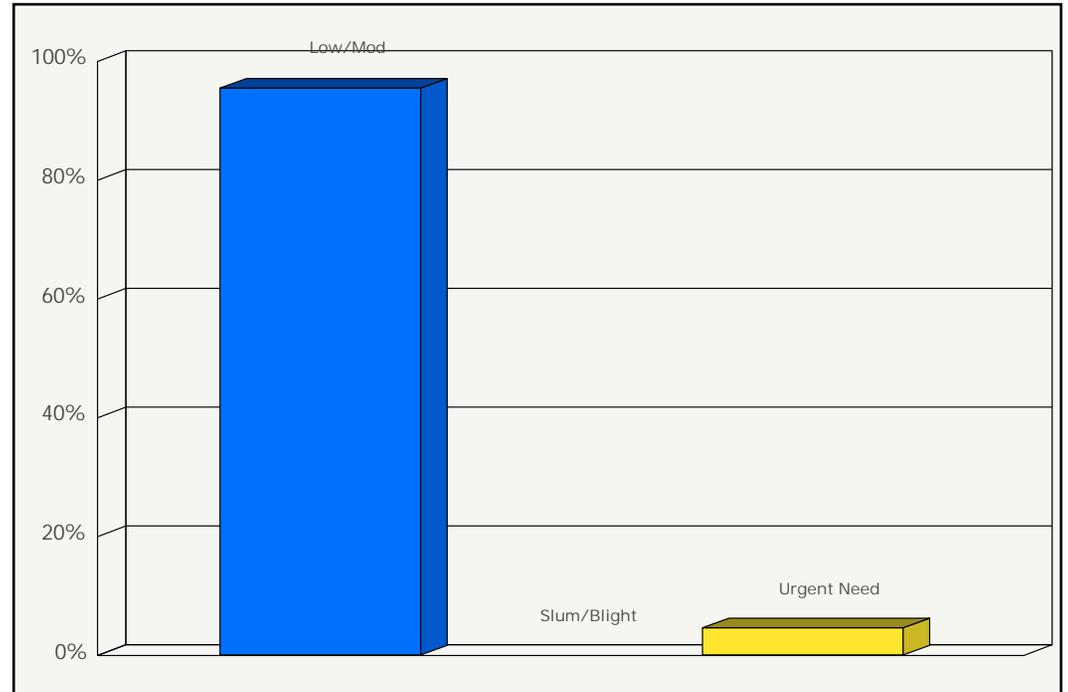

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



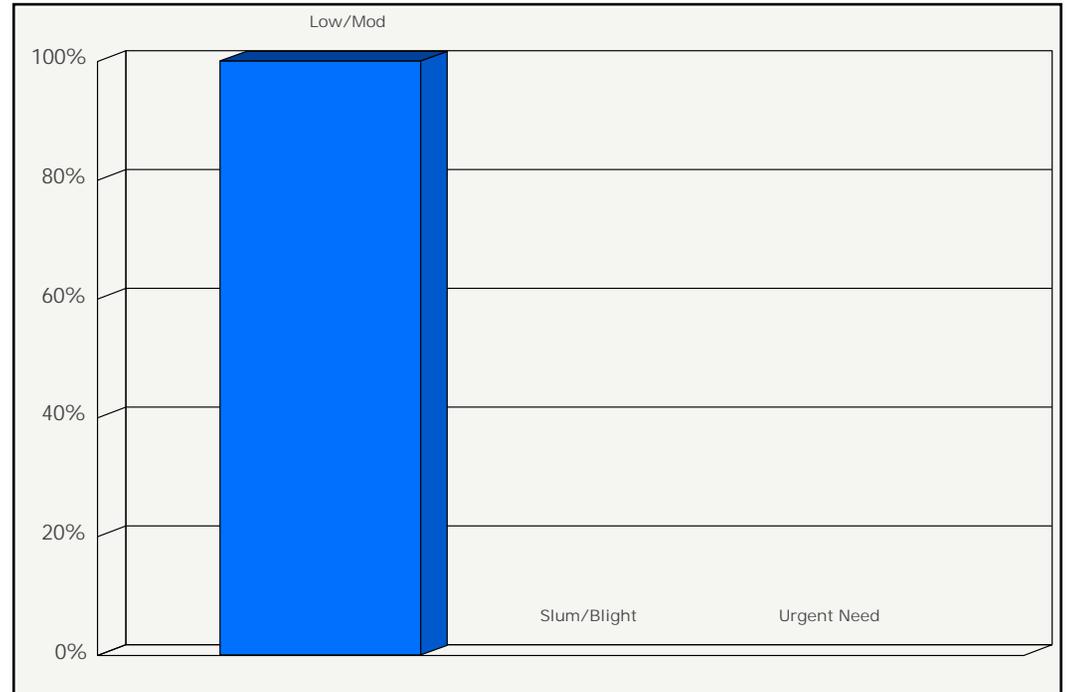

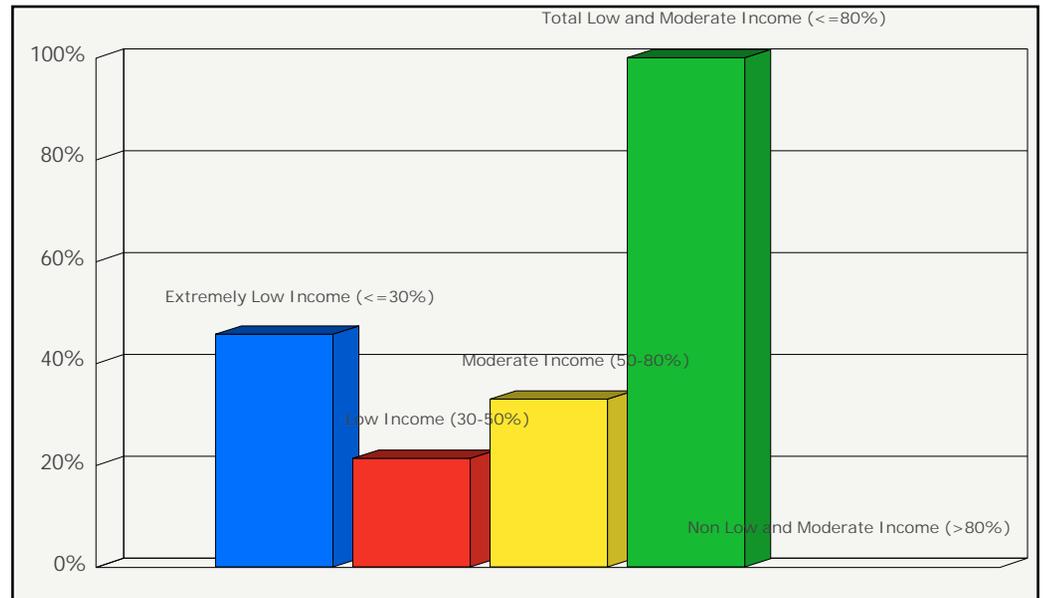

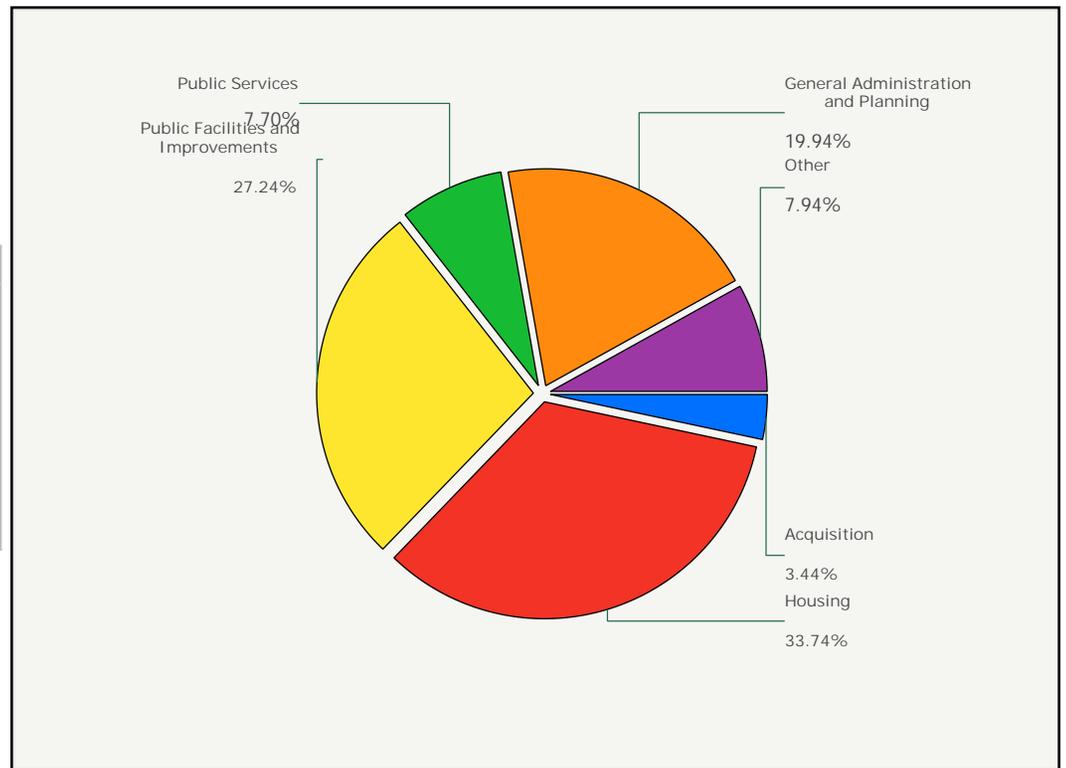

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



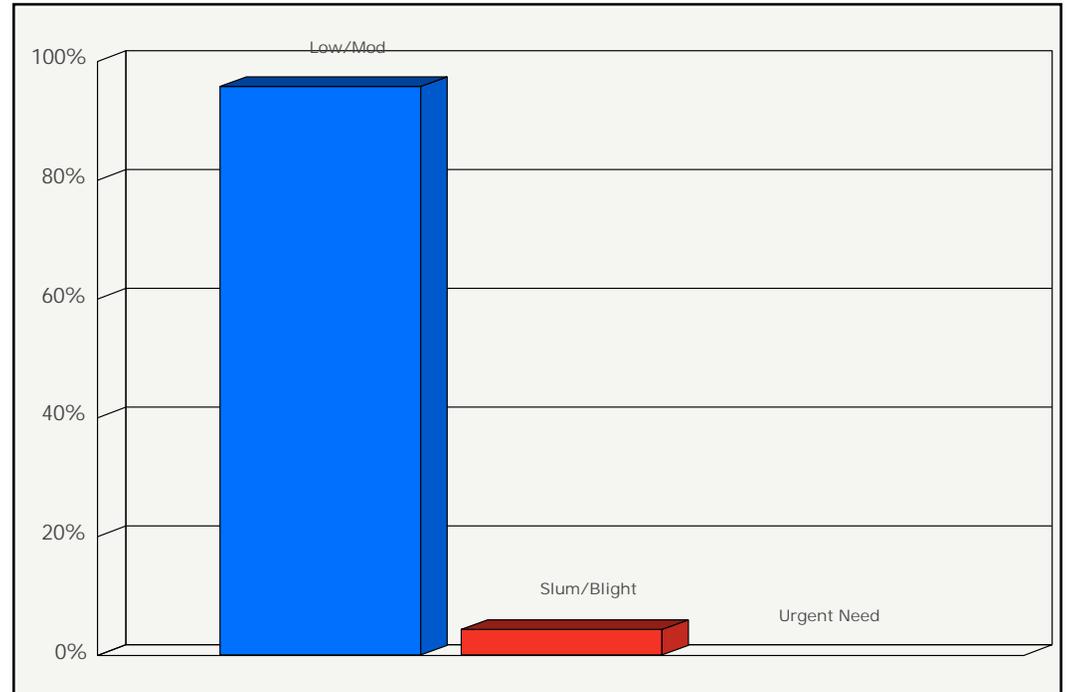

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



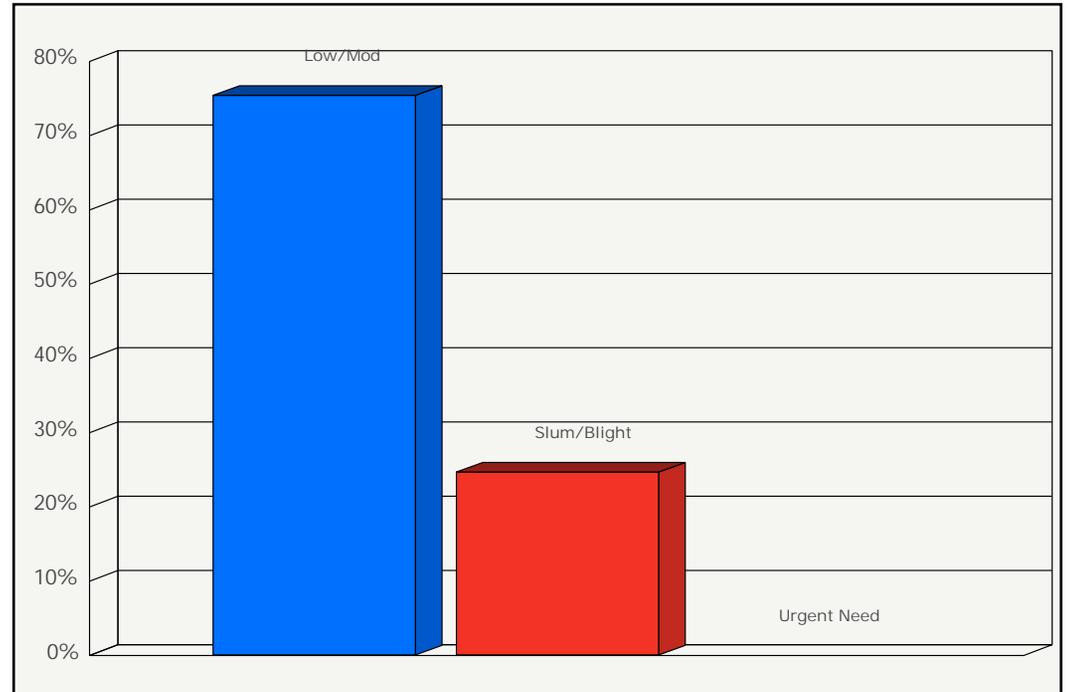

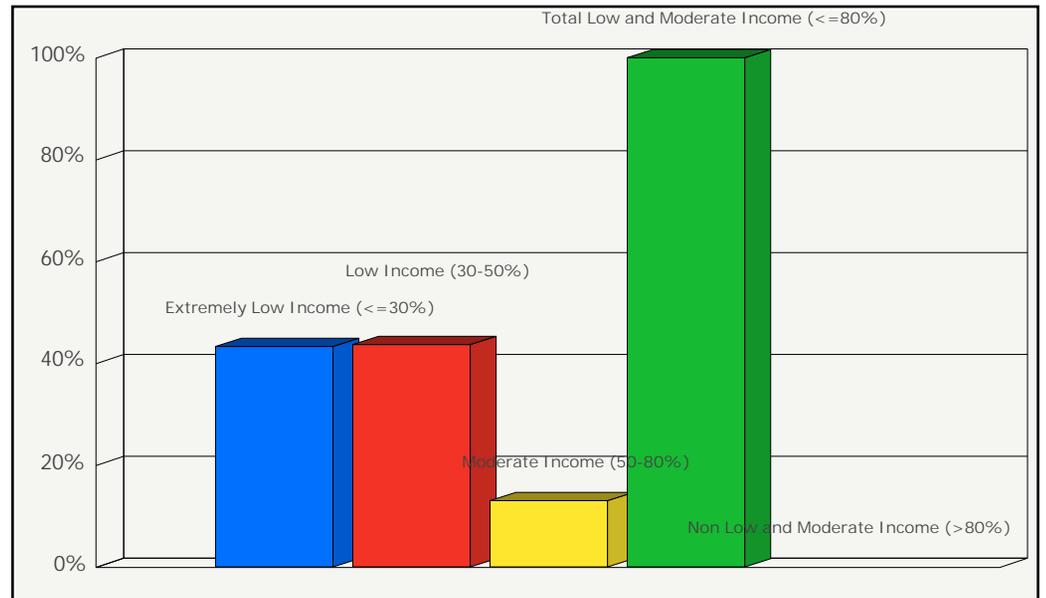

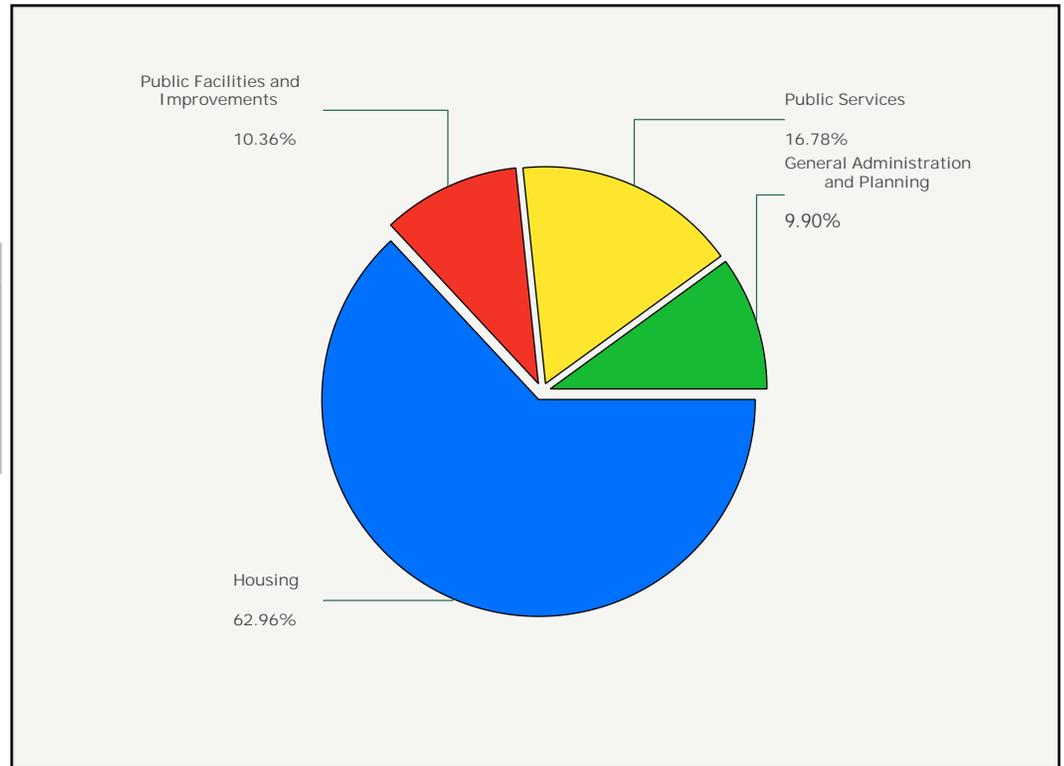

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



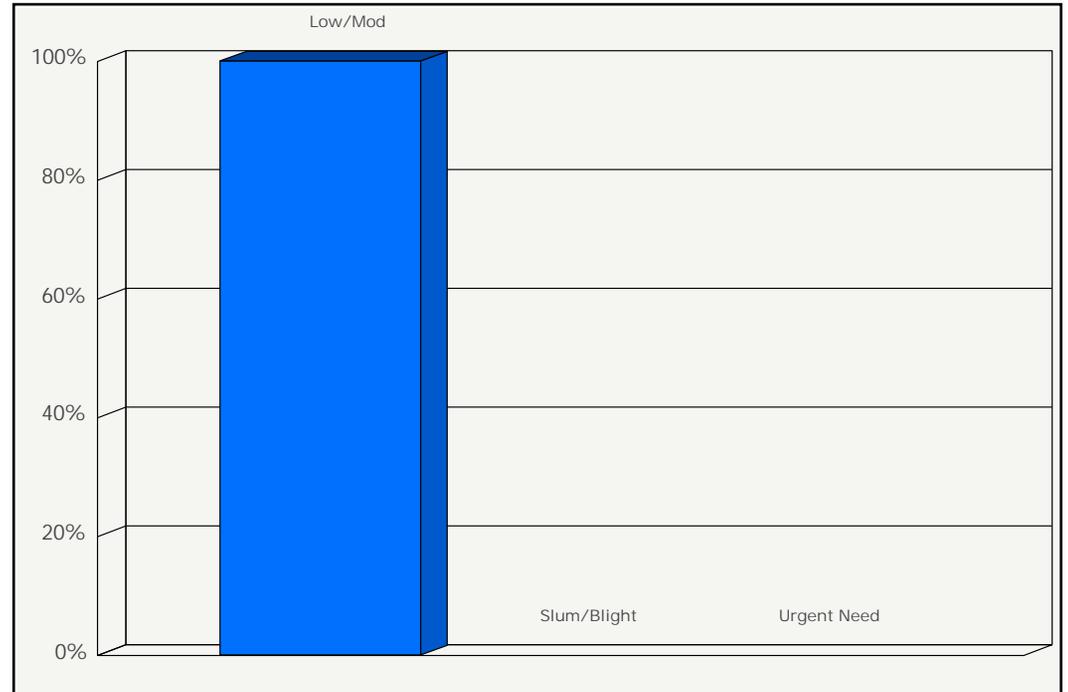

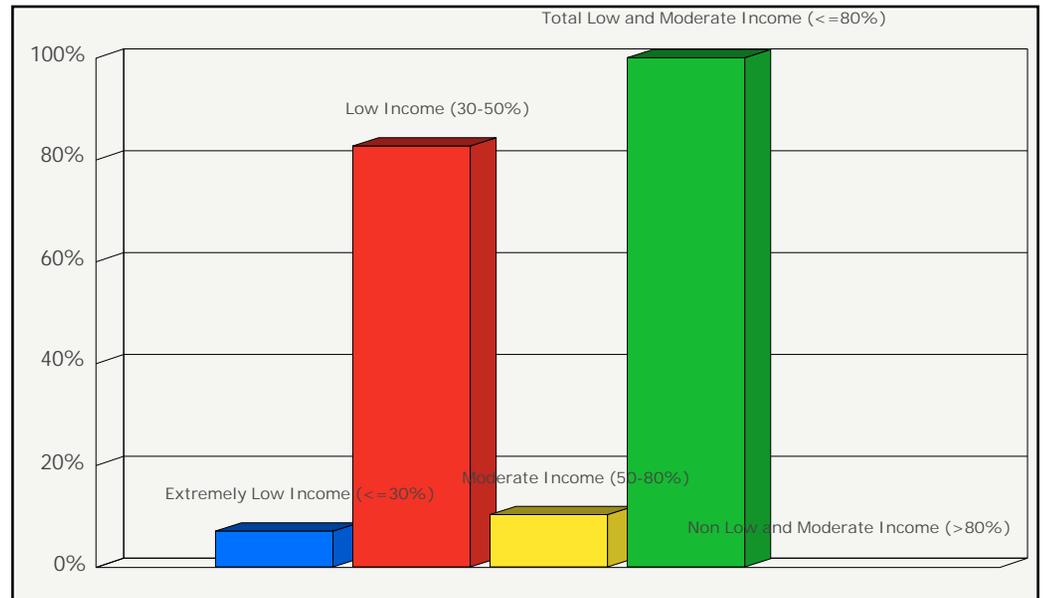

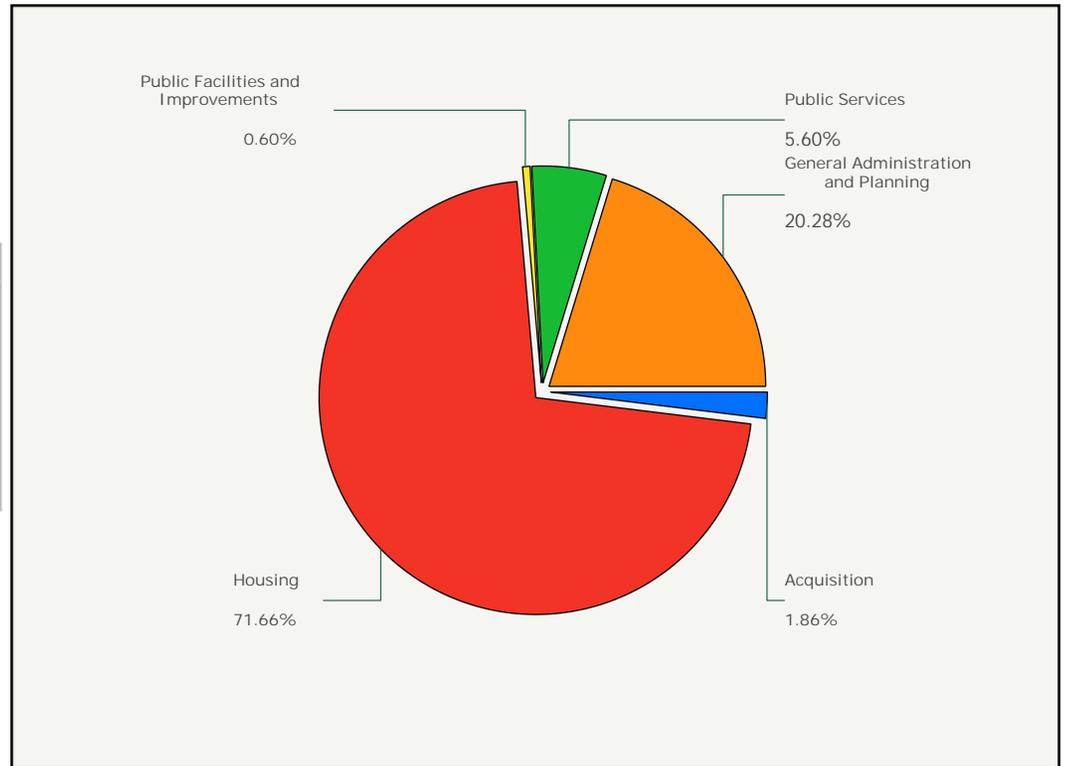

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



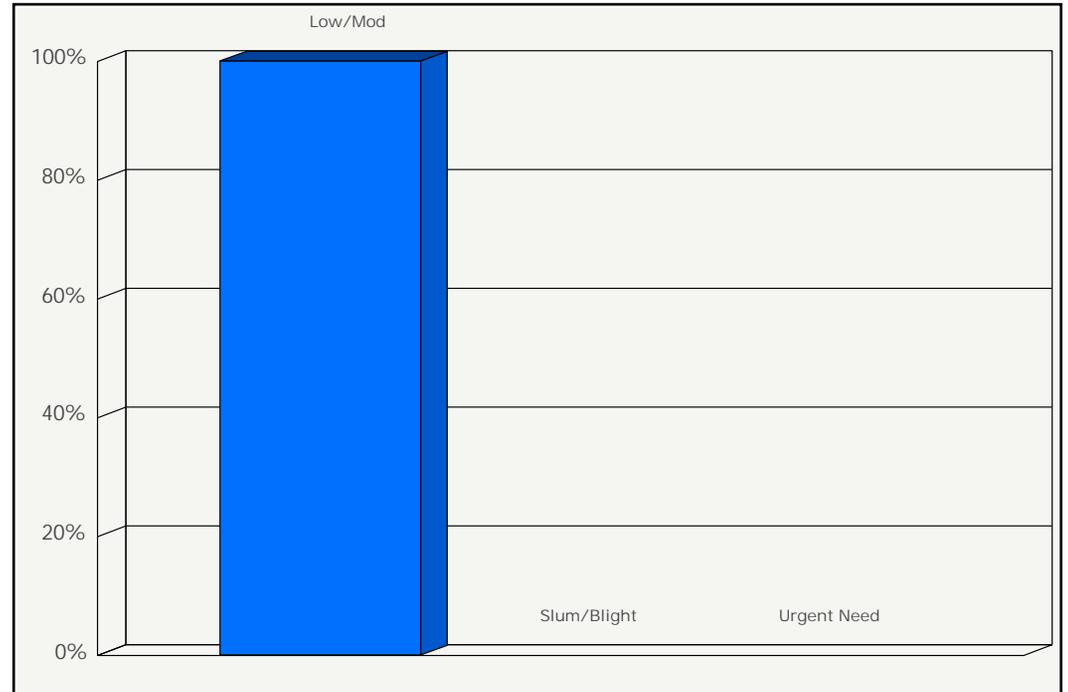

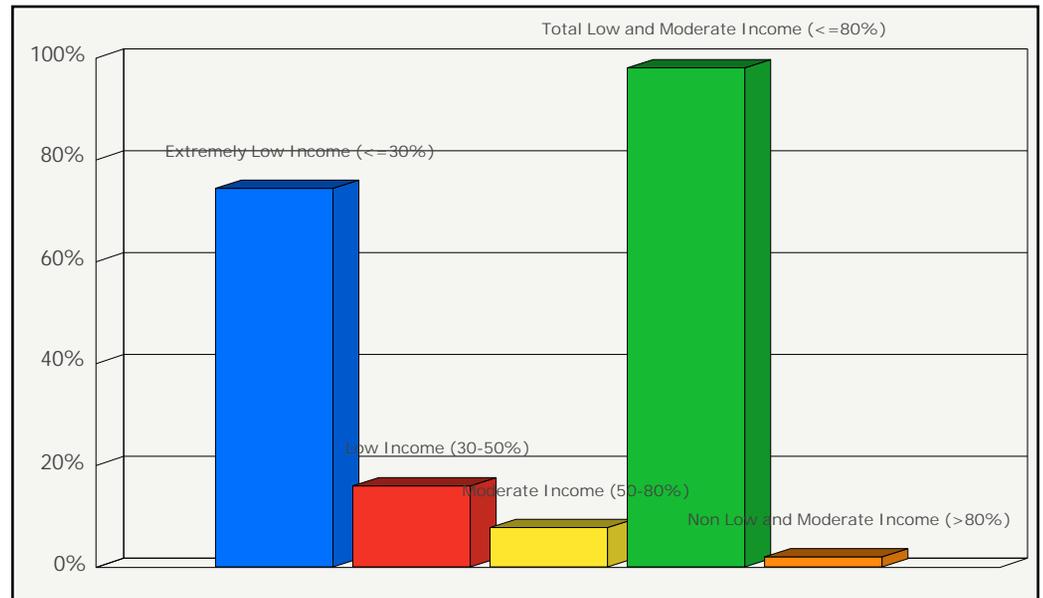

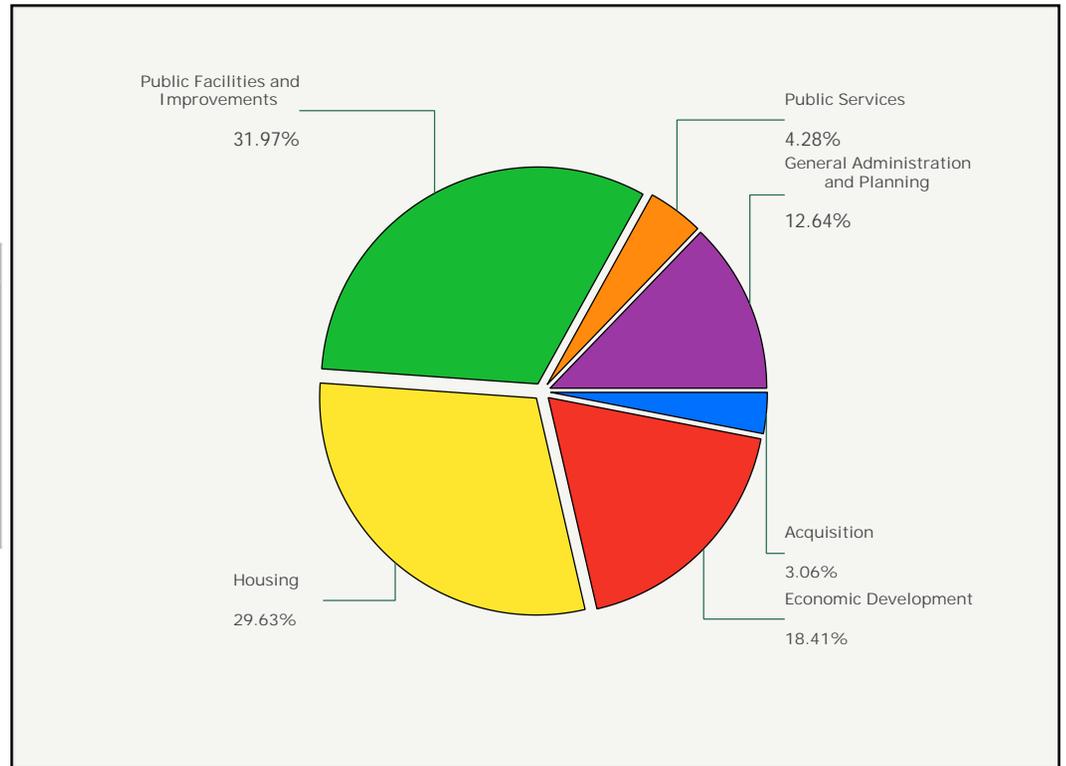

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



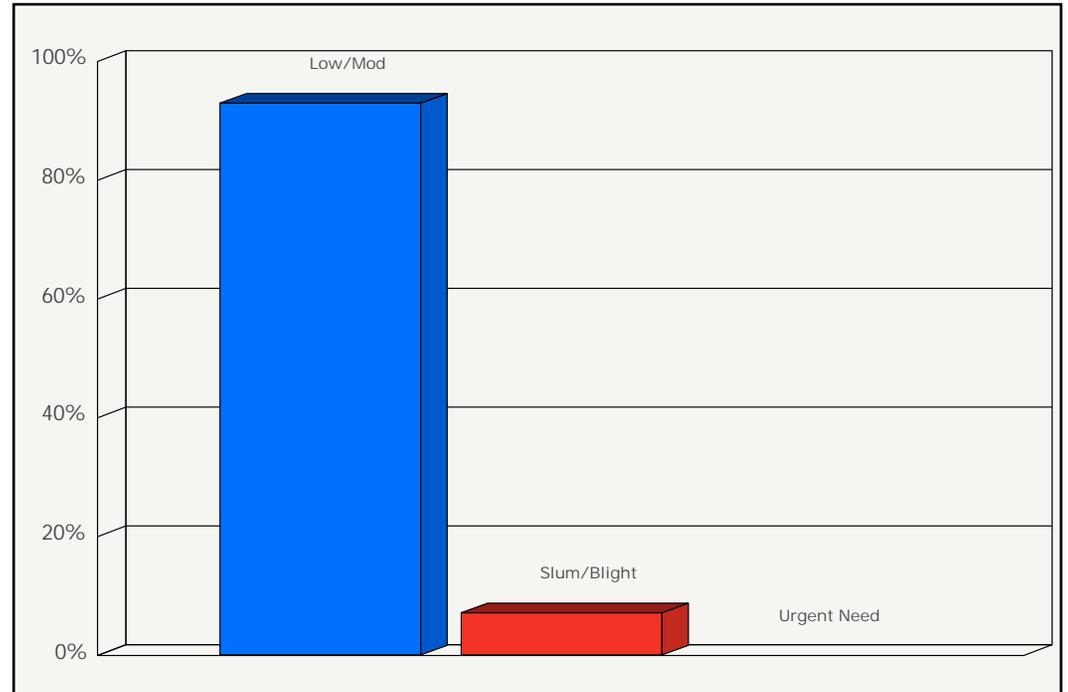

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



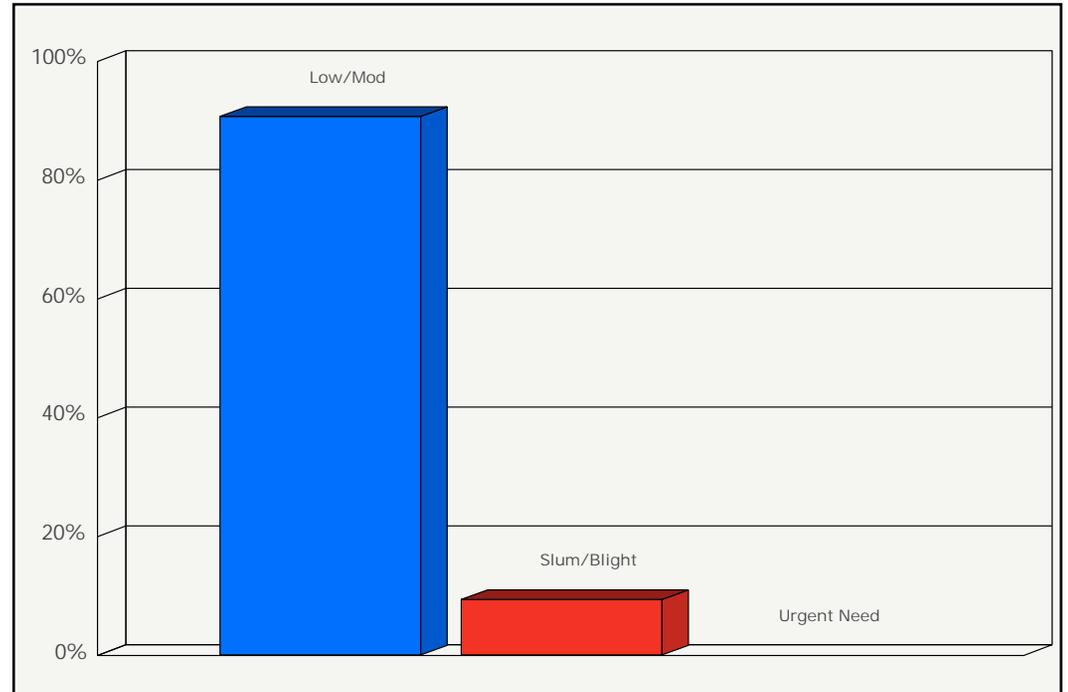

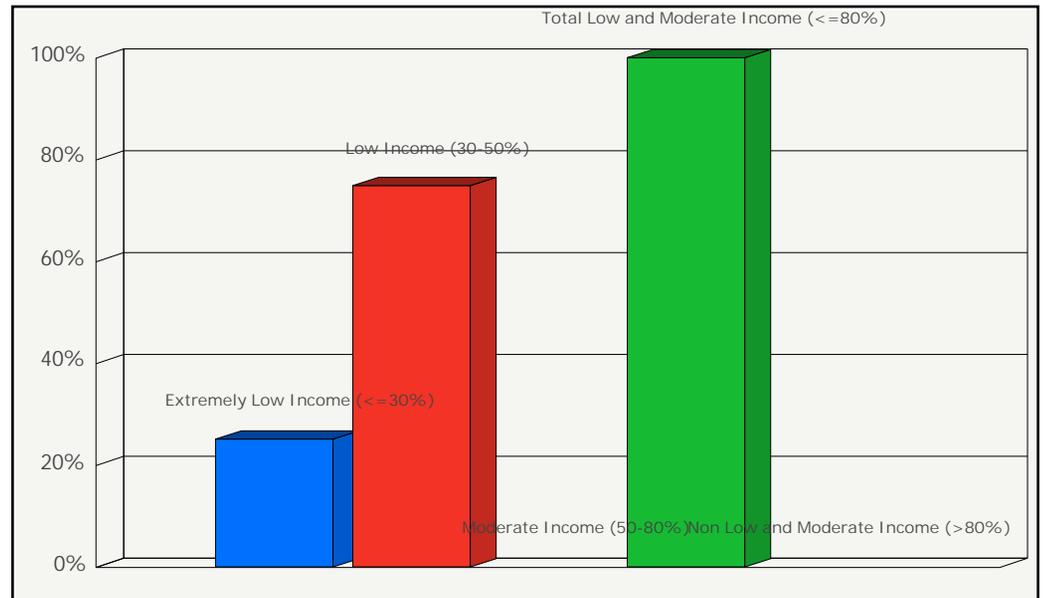

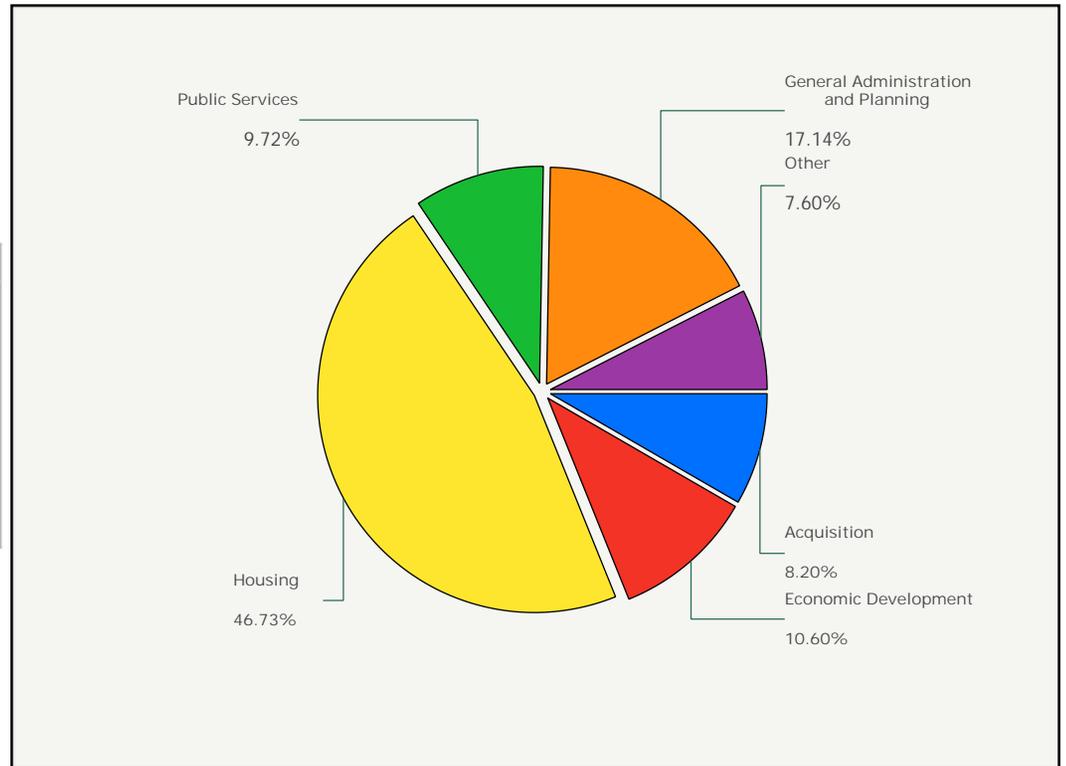

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



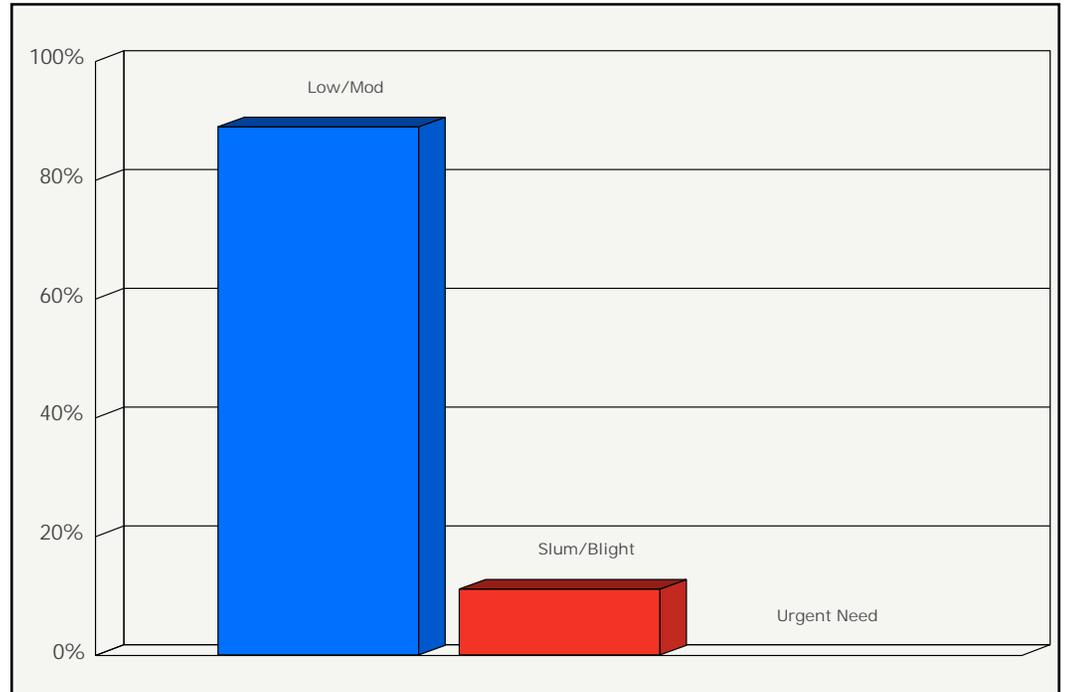

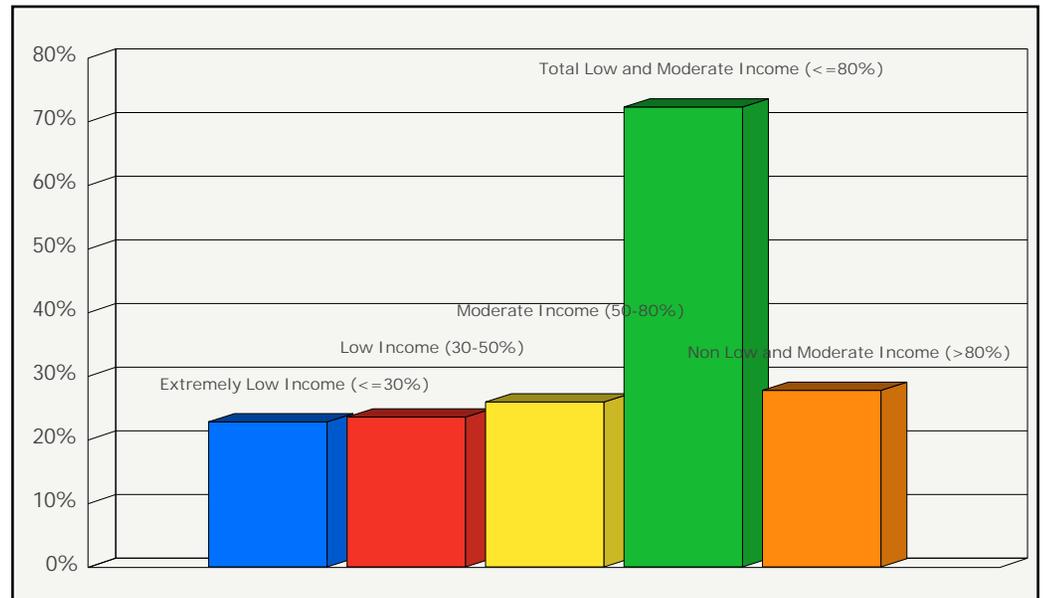

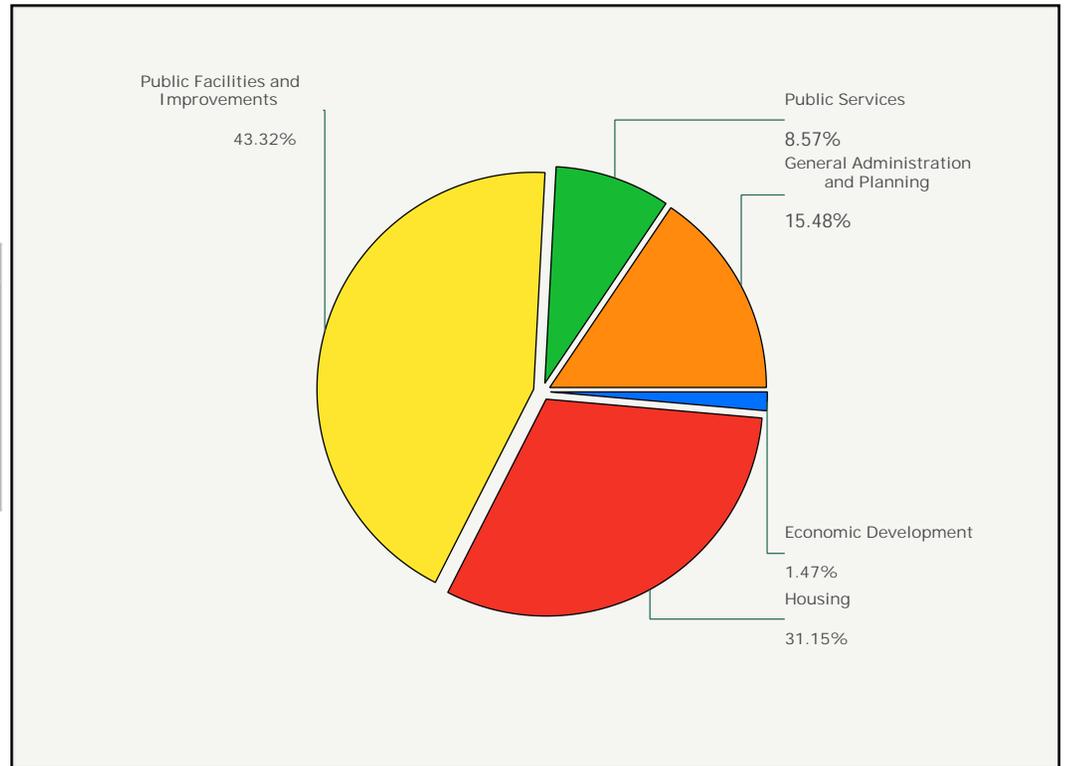

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



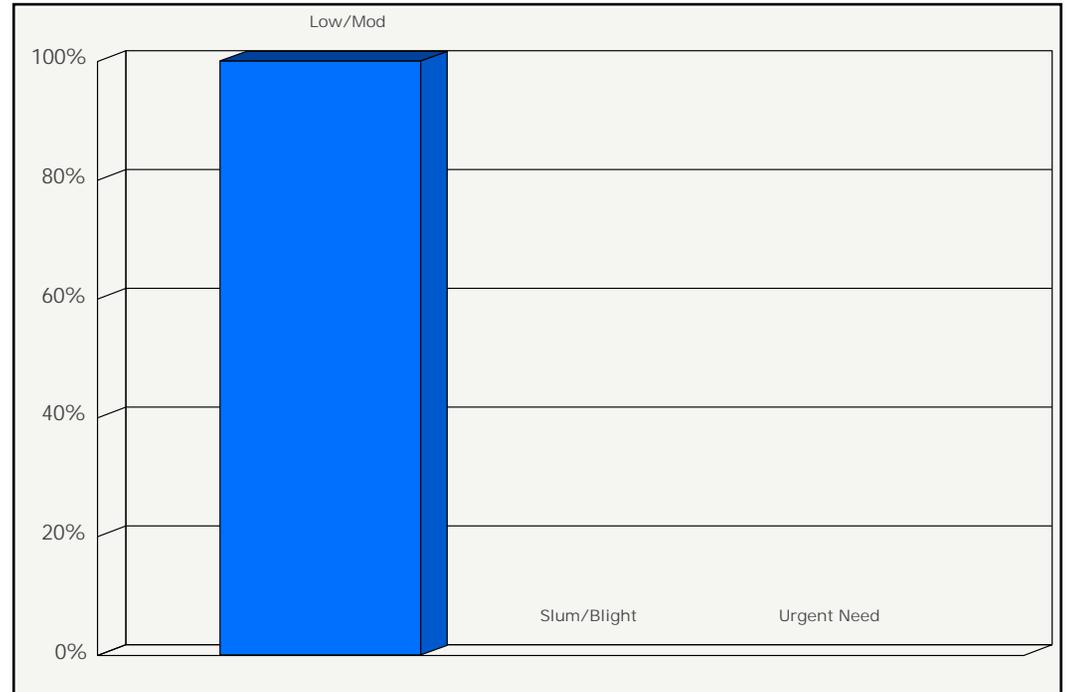

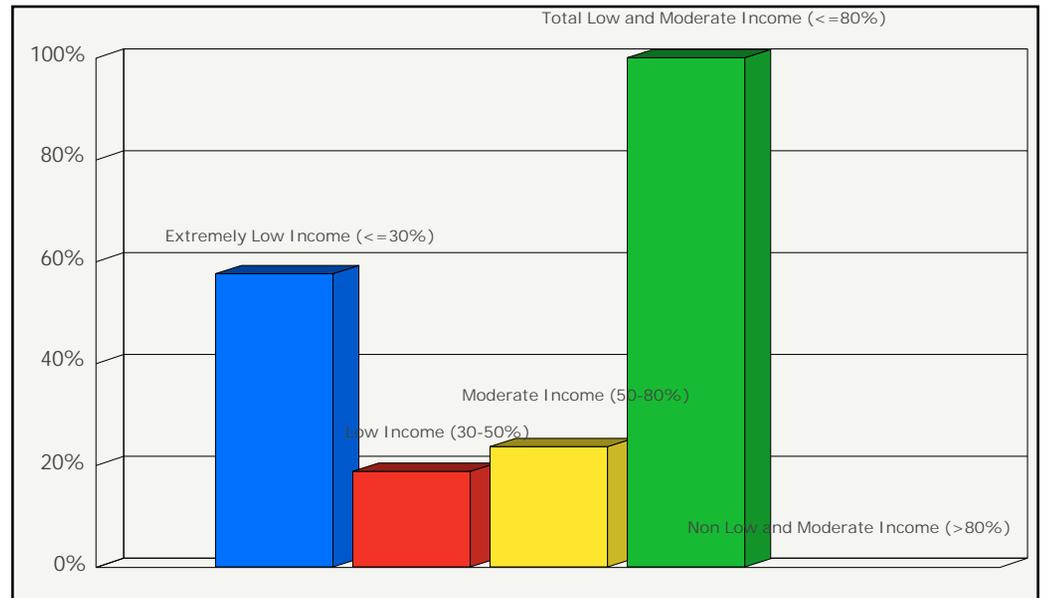

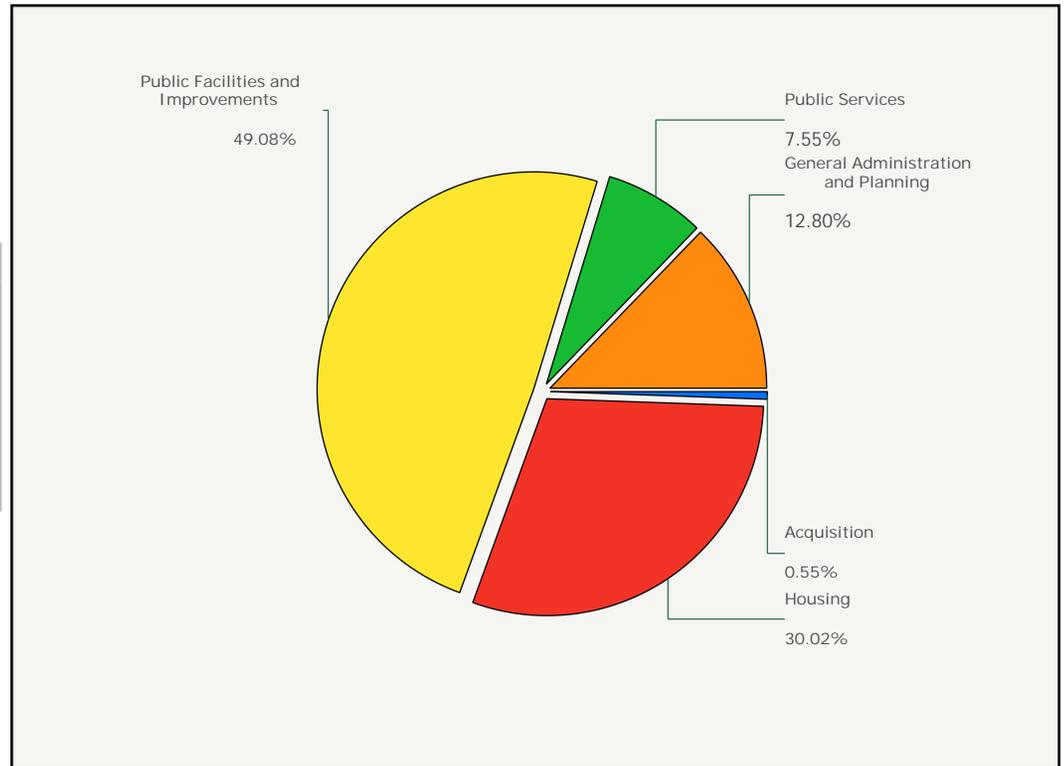

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



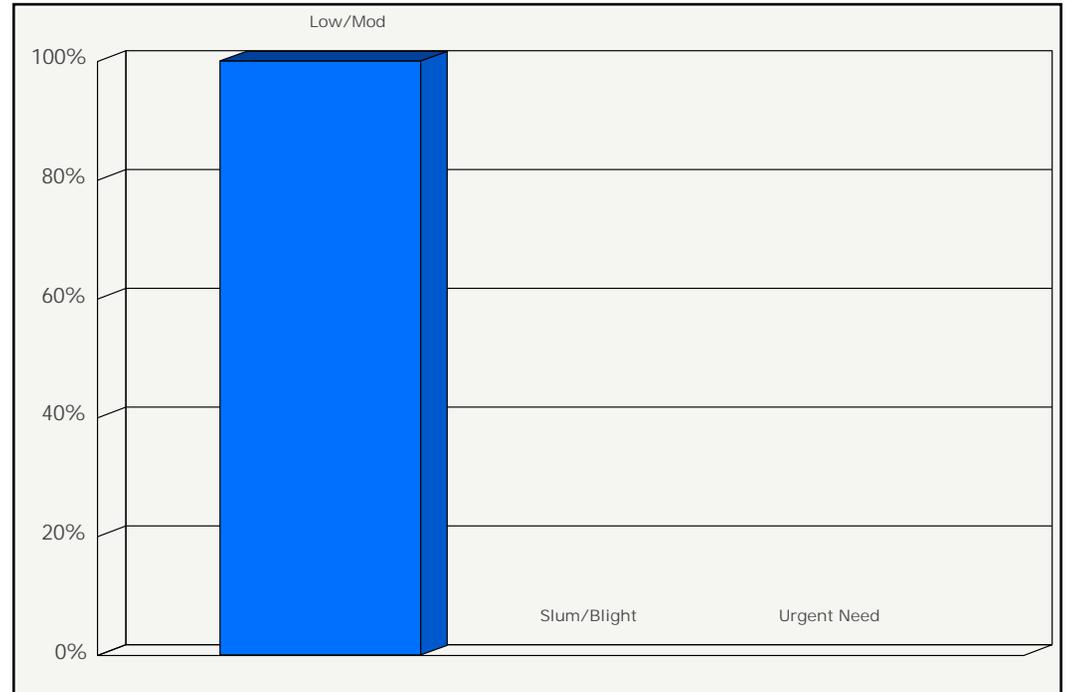

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



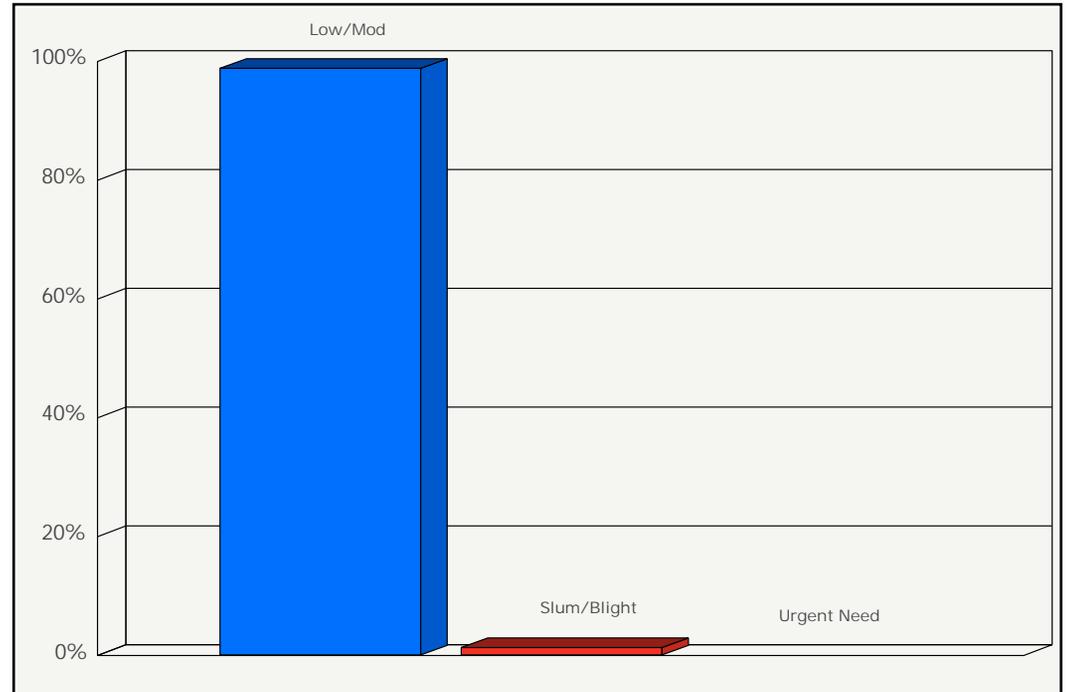

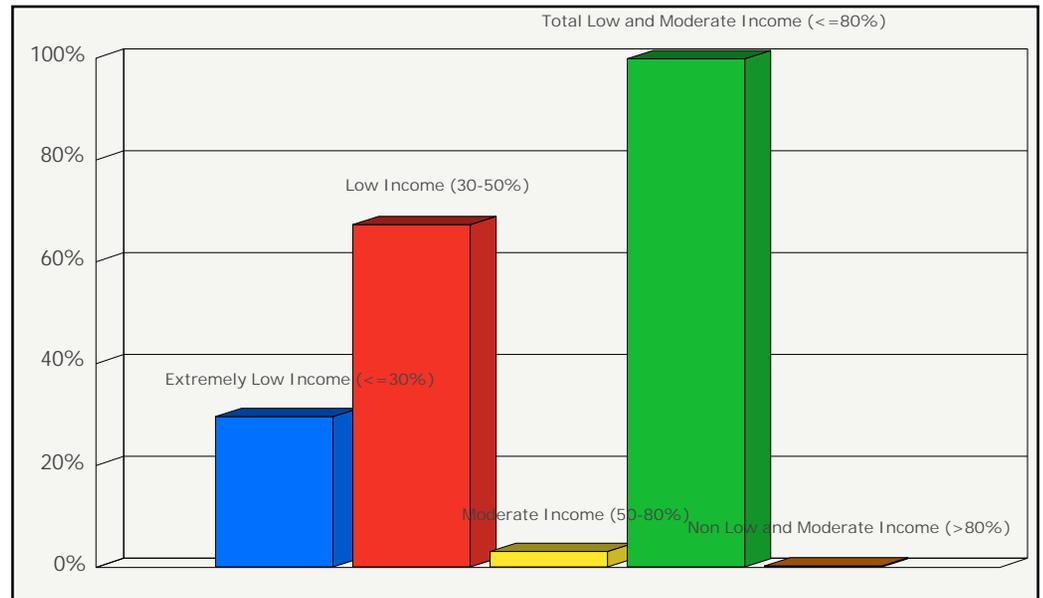

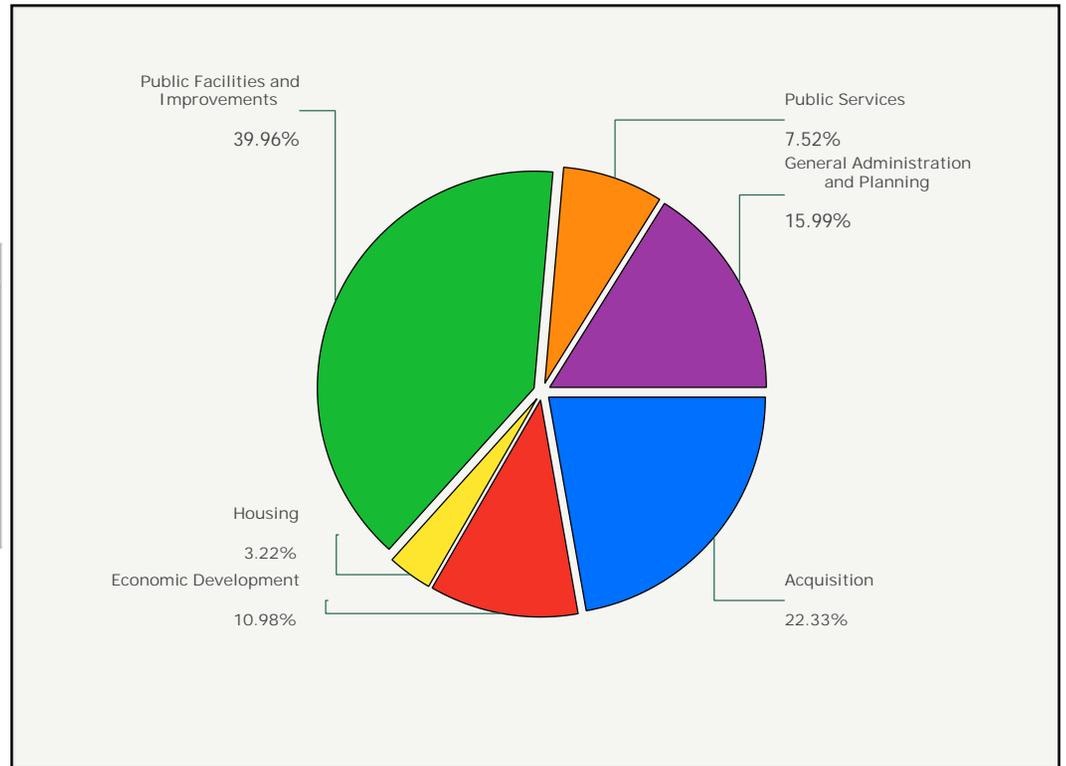

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)

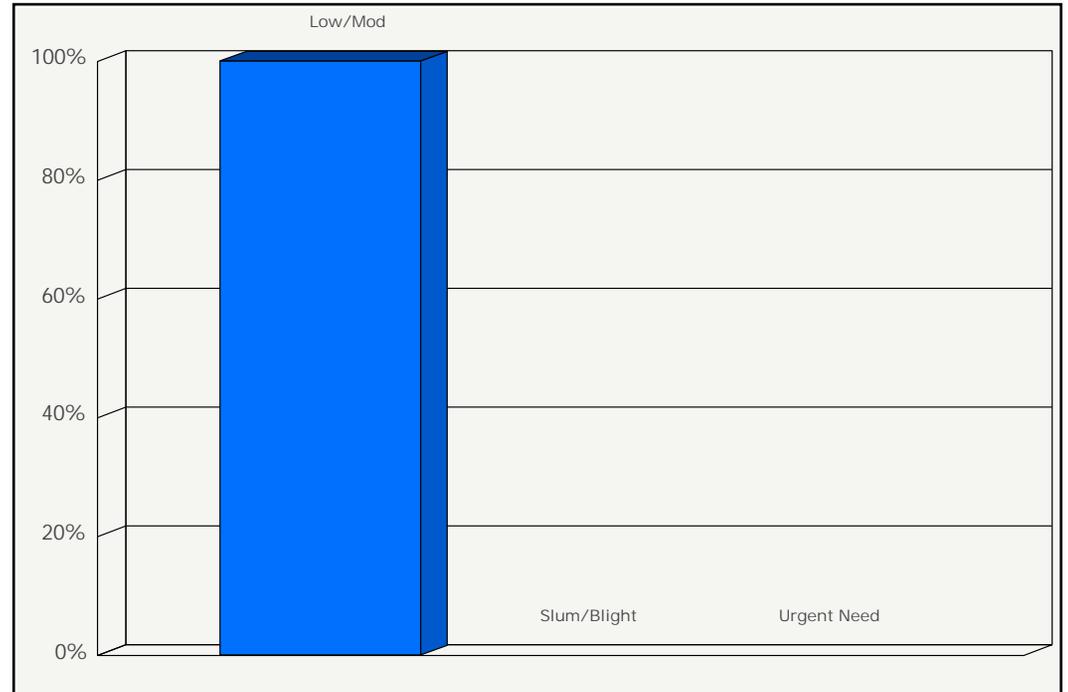

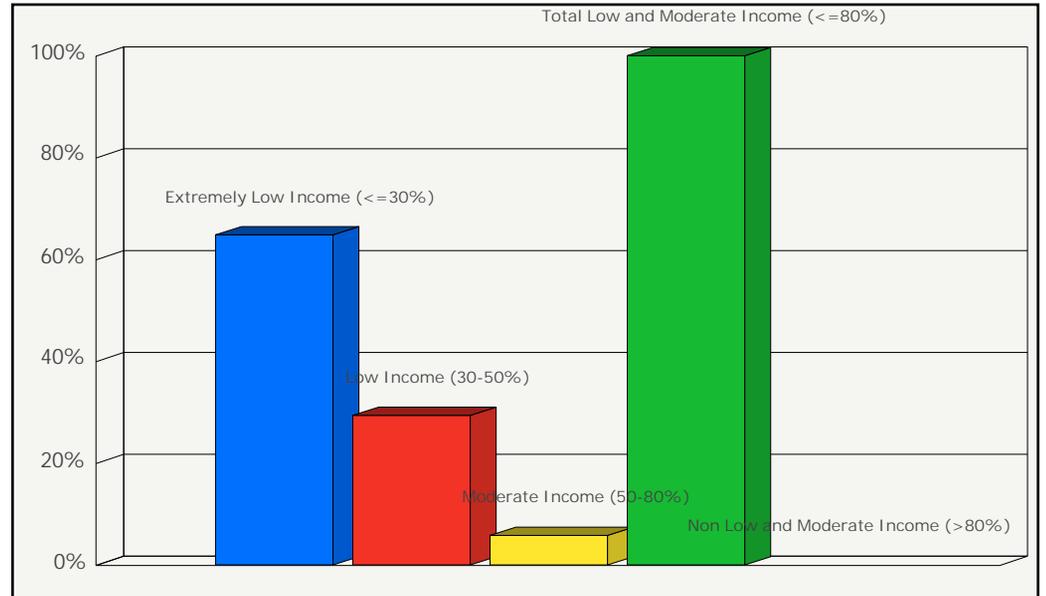

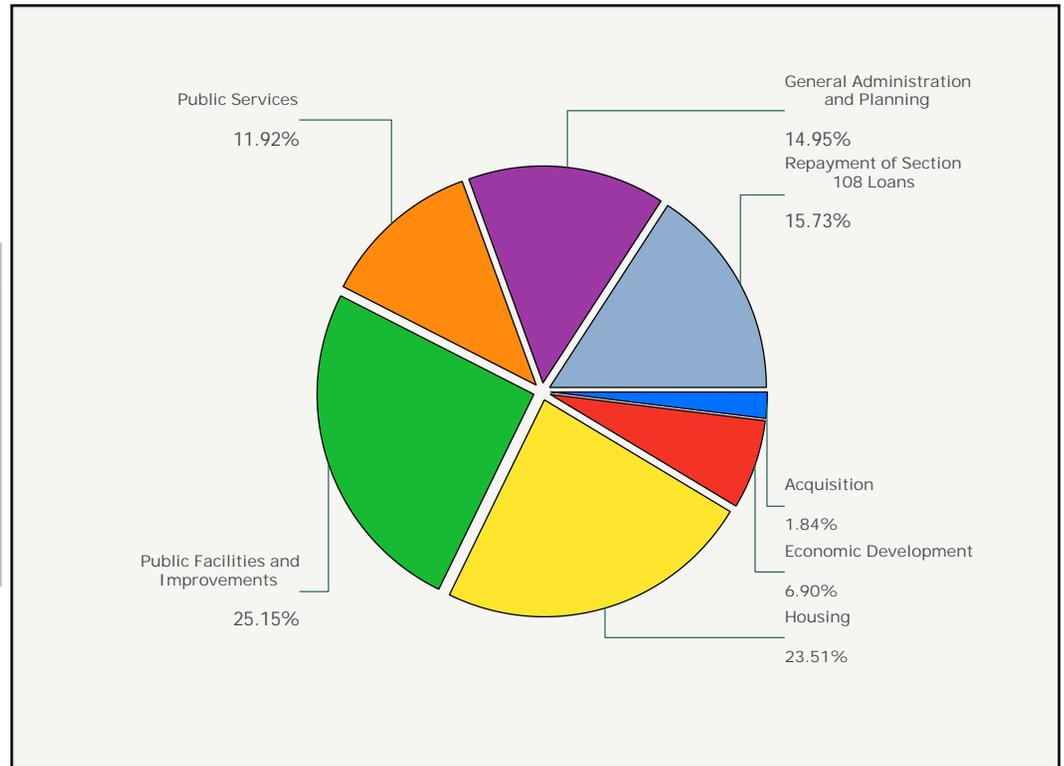

Expenditures by Type of Activity (%)



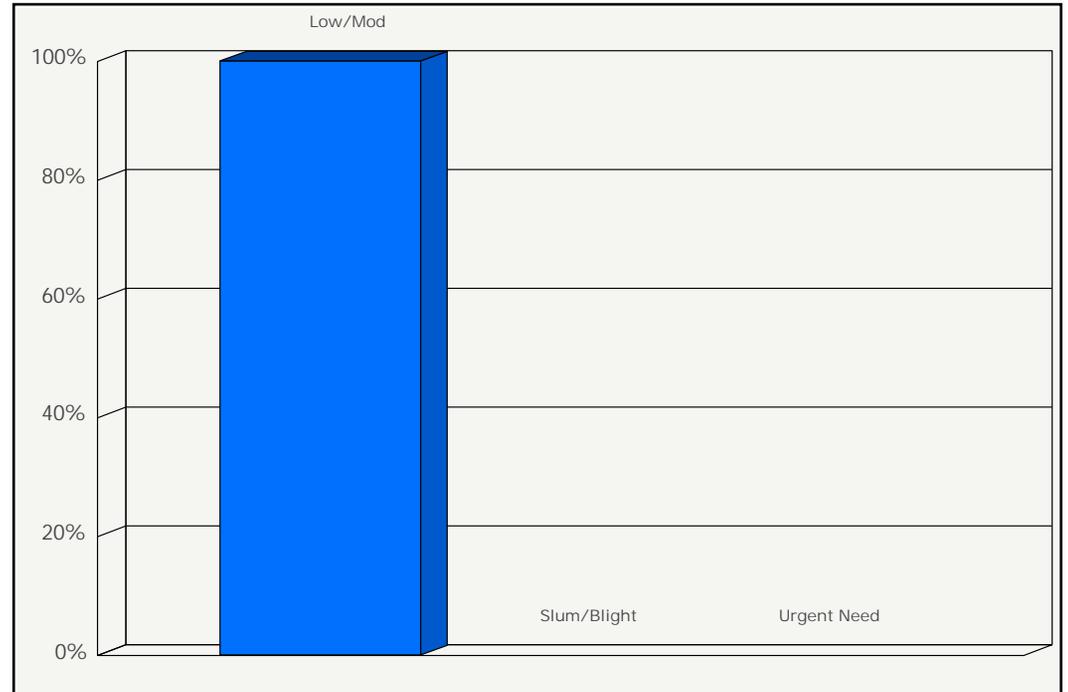

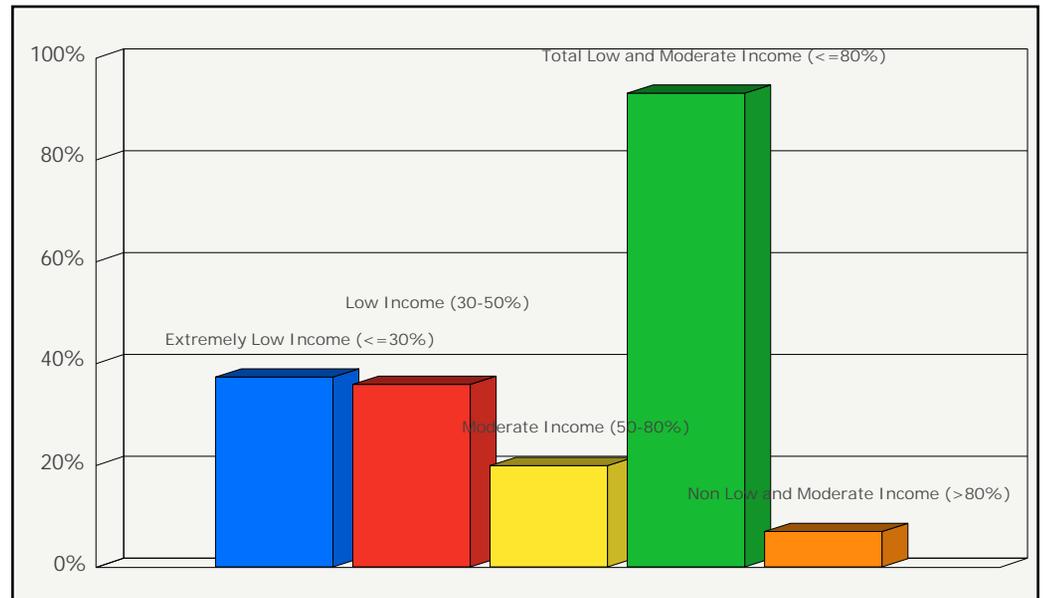
