<p>Eligible Applicants: Schools K-12</p>		
<p>Eligibility Requirements: In order to register, recipients must serve some portion of the pre-kindergarten through grade-12 population and operate primarily for the purpose of education. Schools must provide a valid National Center for Educational Statistics (NCES) number. Educational nonprofits must provide a 501(c) tax identification number</p>

<p>Eligible Applicants: Federal agencies and under Cooperative Purchasing, State, local and tribal governments also have access to specific Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs).</p>		
<p>Eligibility Requirements: Section 211 of the E-Government Act of 2002 (Public Law 107-347)[PDF, 309KB] authorized state and local governments access to Federal Supply Schedule 70, Information Technology (IT), and Consolidated (formerly Corporate Contracts) Schedule contracts, containing IT Special Item Numbers (SINs).</p>

<p>Eligible Applicants: State and local governments are allowed to buy supplies and services directly from all GSA Schedules to facilitate recovery from major disaster or facilitate disaster preparation and response.</p>

5	Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program	www.gsa.gov/propertydonations
<p>Eligible Applicants: Not every state and local government agency or public organization qualifies to receive surplus federal personal property. The States Agencies for Surplus Properties (SASP) maintain a list of organizations that are eligible for surplus personal property. These organizations include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public agencies • Nonprofit educational and public health agencies • Nonprofit and public programs for the elderly • Public airports • Educational agencies of special interest to the Armed Services 		

Eligibility Requirements:

State and local governments, nonprofit organizations, and public agencies can obtain surplus personal property that is no longer needed by federal agencies. The public can buy surplus personal property that is not needed by either federal agencies or by state and local organizations. The public can bid on most of the property at GSA AuctionsSM.

6 Government Wide Acquisition Contracts (GWACs) Program www.gsa.gov/gwacs**Eligible Applicants:**

Warranted contracting officers (a contracting officer appointed pursuant to FAR 1.603)

Eligibility Requirements:

Request a Delegation of Procurement Authority (DPA), which allows direct access to our GWACs.

- Federal Agencies
- Military
- Corporate authorized federal buyers

Eligibility Requirements:

You must have an:

- Activity Address Code (AAC) or
- Government purchase card to pay

8 GSA SmartPay Program www.smartpay.gsa.gov**Eligible Applicants:**

- Federal agencies
- Organizations
- Native American Tribal Governments

Eligibility Requirements:

Eligibility for the program is determined by the GSA SmartPay Contracting Officer. Federal agencies, departments, tribal organizations, and approved non-federal entities to include those eligible to use GSA sources of supply and/or cost-reimbursable contractors, can apply to obtain charge card services under the GSA SmartPay program.

Eligibility Requirements:

Organizations are eligible to use GSA sources of supply and services pursuant to 40 U.S.C. §§ 501 - 502 or other statutory authority; however, some organizations may be eligible to use only specific GSA sources of supply or services.

10 National Wildland Fire Program www.gsa.gov/fireprogram**Eligible Applicants:**

GSA transferred the Wildland Fire Program to the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), who assumed program management responsibilities for the specialized wildland firefighting equipment previously provided by GSA.

Eligibility Requirements:

Items must be ordered through the DOD EMALL. To access DOD EMALL you must have the following:

1. DOD Common Access Card (CAC)/HSPD-12 equivalent
2. External Certificate Authority (ECA) Medium Token

11 Network Services and Telecommunications Program

Eligible Applicants:

- Federal agencies
- Organizations
- Native American Tribal Governments

Eligibility Requirements:

Eligibility for the program is determined by the GSA SmartPay Contracting Officer. Federal departments, tribal organizations, and approved non-federal entities to include those eligible to use GSA sources of supply and/or cost-reimbursable contractors, can apply to obtain charge card services under the GSA SmartPay program. GSA SmartPay® "Travel" Card is required.

12 Personal Property Excess Utilization Program

Eligible Applicants:

- Federal agencies
- State and local organizations
- Citizens

Eligibility Requirements:

GSA helps federal agencies dispose of personal property that is more than they need. After internal screening, GSA facilitates the transfer of excess property from one federal agency to another. GSA also helps federal agencies find and obtain this property. Property acquired from another federal agency does not require payment beyond shipping and transportation costs in most cases.

13 Public Health Emergencies Program

Eligible Applicants:

State, local, tribal and territorial governments

Eligibility Requirements:

These new eligible ordering entities are now authorized to access all Federal Supply Schedules for the purchase of products and services when expending federal grants funds in response to Public Health Emergencies (PHEs) declared by the Secretary of Health and Human Services under section 319 of the Public Health Services Act, codified at 42 U.S.C. § 247d.

14 Real Property Transfers

Eligible Applicants:

- Federal agencies
- Tribes
- Homeless conveyance
- Public Benefit Conveyance
- State and local government
- Non-profit organizations

Eligibility Requirements:

GSA's Office of Real Property Utilization and Disposal handles disposition of Excess & Surplus Real Property for Federal agencies under 40 U.S.C. § 101, et seq. Real Property (land and improvements) that a Federal agency no longer has a mission need for is reported excess to GSA for disposal. Some agencies have their own authority to dispose of Real Property and may not report property to GSA for disposal.

The first step in the disposal process is to screen the Excess Real Property for other Federal agency needs. Agencies have 30 days to let GSA know, in writing, of their interest in the property. Due to the short screening period it is important that the tribes let BIA and GSA know of their interest in real property as soon as they are aware that the property going to be reported excess. The BIA is authorized to request a transfer of excess real property from GSA if BIA determines that the property may assist tribes in carrying out a contract under the ISDEAA.

15 Travel Programs

Eligible Applicants:

- Federal agencies
- Organizations
- Native American Tribal Governments

Eligibility Requirements:

BIA will request GSA to transfer the property under Federal Management Regulation (FMR) for further conveyance to the tribe under ISDEAA. Federal agencies are required to pay a transfer fee equal to the full fair market value of the Real Property or request waiver of the payment. The waiver of the transfer fee must be approved by the Administrator of GSA and Director of the Office Management and Budget (OMB). Not all waiver requests are approved. If the BIA does not have the funds to pay the transfer fee, the tribe may also fund the cost of the transfer through BIA.

16 Vehicle Buying Program

Eligible Applicants:

GSA Order ADM 4800.2H, Eligibility to Use GSA Sources of Supply and Services, provides definitive guidelines concerning eligibility requirements and limitations for agencies, activities, and organizations. In addition, the following appendices identify those specific agencies, activities, and organizations for which eligibility determinations have been made:

Eligibility Requirements:

If the transfer is approved, GSA will transfer custody and accountability to BIA for the purpose of further transferring the property to the tribe under ISDEA.

Eligibility Requirements:

The Indian Self Determination Act Amendments of 1994 - a tribal organization, when carrying out a contract, grant or cooperative agreement under ISDEAA, is deemed an executive agency for purposes of 40 U.S.C. § 501. (See 25 U.S.C. § 450j(k)). Additionally, if the self-determination contract contains a provision authorizing interagency motor pool vehicles and related services, as provided in Section 103 of the Indian Self-Determination Act Amendments of 1994, the tribe or tribal organization is eligible to use GSA Fleet motor vehicles and related services, if available (See 25 U.S.C. § 4501.) Authorization to use GSA sources of supply under the authority cited in this paragraph does not include purchases for resale unless the contract, grant, cooperative agreement, or funding agreement authorizes such activity. Information on the authority for resale must be provided to GSA, and based on that information, GSA must concur. (b) The Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA) As provided in section 101 of Pub. L. 110-411 (the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Reauthorization Act of 2008), for purposes of 40 U.S.C. § 501, each Indian tribe or tribally designated housing entity shall be considered to be an executive agency in carrying out a program, service, or other activity under a block grant pursuant to NAHASDA; and each tribe or tribally designated housing entity shall have access to sources of supply on the same basis as employees of an executive agency. (See 25 U.S.C. § 4111 (j)). Authorization to use GSA sources of supply under the authority cited in this paragraph does not include purchases for resale unless the contract, grant, cooperative agreement, or funding agreement authorizes such activity. Information on the authority for resale must be provided to GSA, and based on that information, GSA must concur.
