



HUD Invests in New Hampshire

HUD is the Department of Opportunity. True to its mission, HUD is working closely with state and local leaders across New Hampshire to promote homeownership, support community development, and increase access to affordable housing, free from discrimination. Below are some examples of HUD at work in New Hampshire.

Housing Highlights



Building Stronger Communities in the Century of Cities

Since 2010, HUD has **invested \$60 million** in the State through the **Community Development Block Grant Program**. CDBG supports a broad range of public improvements for places like community centers and parks.



Easing the Rental Crisis

HUD provides **22,565 New Hampshire households** with rental assistance. That assistance **impacts 35,862 individuals** who reside in those households.



Creating Sustainable Communities

HUD programs are designed to support next-generation sustainable housing and communities. Since 2010, HUD has helped produce **3,536 healthy and energy-efficient homes** in New Hampshire.



Ending Homelessness

On any given night in New Hampshire, HUD **helps to shelter 1,243 persons** experiencing homelessness. HUD is currently providing permanent homes for **177 formerly homeless veterans** and has helped house **247 homeless veterans** since 2008.



Leveling the Playing Field

HUD is committed to ensuring that every American has the chance to pursue housing opportunities free from discrimination. Last year in New Hampshire, HUD **resolved 21 housing discrimination cases affecting 37 people**.



Helping Families Secure Quality Housing

The Federal Housing Administration (FHA) insures the mortgages of **25,319 New Hampshire homeowners**, helping drive a statewide homeownership rate of **70.3 percent**.
