Payments to Borrowers represent estimated dollars paid directly to each state which in turn will be made available by state AG office to borrowers who have filed a claim and are found to have not properly been offered loss mitigation or were otherwise improperly foreclosed on and will thus be eligible for approx. \$2,000, depending upon level of response.

NOTE values have been rounded to the nearest thousand.

3. Oklahoma is currently not a party to the settlement.
